¹² I want you to know, brothers, that what has happened to me has really served to advance the gospel, ¹³ so that it has become known throughout the whole imperial guard and to all the rest that my imprisonment is for Christ. ¹⁴ And most of the brothers, having become confident in the Lord by my imprisonment, are much more bold to speak the word without fear.

¹⁵ Some indeed preach Christ from envy and rivalry, but others from good will. ¹⁶ The latter do it out of love, knowing that I am put here for the defense of the gospel. ¹⁷ The former proclaim Christ out of selfish ambition, not sincerely but thinking to afflict me in my imprisonment. ¹⁸ What then? Only that in every way, whether in pretense or in truth, Christ is proclaimed, and in that I rejoice.

Yes, and I will rejoice, ¹⁹ for I know that through your prayers and the help of the Spirit of Jesus Christ this will turn out for my deliverance, ²⁰ as it is my eager expectation and hope that I will not be at all ashamed, but that with full courage now as always Christ will be honored in my body, whether by life or by death.

"Follow Up on the Coast"

Acts 9: 32 - 43

³² Now as Peter went here and there among them all, he came down also to the saints who lived at Lydda. ³³ There he found a man named Aeneas, bedridden for eight years, who was paralyzed. ³⁴ And Peter said to him, "Aeneas, Jesus Christ heals you; rise and make your bed." And immediately he rose. ³⁵ And all the residents of Lydda and Sharon saw him, and they turned to the Lord.

³⁶ Now there was in Joppa a disciple named Tabitha, which, translated, means Dorcas. She was full of good works and acts of charity. ³⁷ In those days she became ill and died, and when they had washed her, they

laid her in an upper room. ³⁸ Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, hearing that Peter was there, sent two men to him, urging him, "Please come to us without delay." ³⁹ So Peter rose and went with them. And when he arrived, they took him to the upper room. All the widows stood beside him weeping and showing tunics and other garments that Dorcas made while she was with them. ⁴⁰ But Peter put them all outside, and knelt down and prayed; and turning to the body he said, "Tabitha, arise." And she opened her eyes, and when she saw Peter she sat up. ⁴¹ And he gave her his hand and raised her up. Then, calling the saints and widows, he presented her alive. ⁴² And it became known throughout all Joppa, and many believed in the Lord. ⁴³ And he stayed in Joppa for many days with one Simon, a tanner.

Peter here takes it another step in its certain progress to gather men and women from every tribe, tongue and nation on the planet. Praise be to Christ!

Matthew 24: 14 - 31

¹⁴ This gospel of the kingdom <u>shall be</u> preached in the whole world as a testimony to all the nations, and then the end will come ...³⁰ And then the sign of the Son of Man will appear in the sky, and then all the tribes of the earth will mourn, and they will see the Son of Man coming on the clouds of the sky with power and great glory. ³¹ And He will send forth His angels with a great trumpet and they will gather together His elect from the four winds, from one end of the sky to the other.

Philippians 1: 12 - 20

¹² Now I want you to know, brethren, that my circumstances have turned out for **the greater progress of the gospel**, ¹³ so that my imprisonment in *the cause of* Christ has become well known throughout the whole praetorian guard and to everyone else, ¹⁴ and that most of the brethren, trusting in the Lord because of my imprisonment, have far more courage to speak the word of God without fear. ¹⁵ Some, to be sure, are preaching Christ even from envy and strife, but some also from good will; ¹⁶ the latter *do it* out of love, knowing that I am appointed for the defense of the gospel; ¹⁷ the former proclaim Christ out of selfish ambition rather than from pure motives, thinking to cause me distress in my imprisonment. ¹⁸ What then? Only that in every way, whether in pretense or in truth, Christ is proclaimed; and in this I rejoice.

Yes, and I will rejoice, ¹⁹ for I know that this will turn out for my deliverance through your prayers and the provision of the Spirit of Jesus Christ, ²⁰ according to my earnest expectation and hope, that I will not be put to shame in anything, but *that* with all boldness, Christ will even now, as always, be exalted in my body, whether by life or by death.

Acts—Series Overview

The Expansion of the Gospel Witness with Power

Monday

READ Acts 9:32-43; 4:23-31; Philippians 1:12-20 DISCUSS, How is the passage in chapter nine an answer to the prayer in chapter four? What is Peter doing? What is God doing? How certain is the progress of the gospel? PRAY, "Lord God, thank You for Your faithfulness in building Your Church. Teach us to trust You always."

Tuesday

READ Acts 9:32-35; John 5:1-9; 14:8-14 DISCUSS, Compare and contrast these healings. What is the significance of Peter following Jesus' ministry? How did Jesus promise that they would do similar miracles? Why? PRAY, "Jesus, thank You for demonstrating Your power and authority directly in Your earthly ministry and then through the apostles to verify that You had given them Your authority on earth. Teach us to believe Your Word that You have given us through them."

Wednesday

READ Acts 9:36-42; Mark 5:35-43; John 14:8-14. DISCUSS, How did Jesus prepare Peter for this? Do you realize that according to Jesus, bringing someone to spiritual life in Him is a greater miracle than resurrecting a physical corpse? Are you born again? Are you praying for your neighbors to be born again? PRAY, "Lord, You are the only One able to give new life. You enabled Peter to raise Tabitha. Please give life to our neighbors, coworkers, friends, and family."

Thursday

READ Acts 9:32-43; Matthew 16:18. DISCUSS, How certain is it that the Gospel will go to all the nations? How does your life demonstrate you believe that? PRAY, "Lord, You went to the cross for us. Help us take up our cross and follow You joyfully."

Friday

READ Acts 9:32-43; 4:23-31; Matthew 24:14; Revelation 5:6-14. DISCUSS, How has God been teaching you from these passages this week? REJOICE if you have the privilege of being Christ's beloved! PRAY for renewal and revival across our land.

Saturday

PREPARE today for the worship service tomorrow. *There will be both the live-stream and in-person services available*.

READ Acts 10:1-48; Matthew 28:16-20. Invite others to join you for either the *live-stream or in-person service* tomorrow. Ask Jesus to help us in the transition back to gathered worship in the building.

Acts 4: 29 - 31

²⁹ And now, Lord, take note of their threats, and grant that Your bond-servants may speak Your word with all confidence, ³⁰ while You extend Your hand to heal, and signs and wonders take place through the name of Your holy servant Jesus." ³¹ And when they had prayed, the place where they had gathered together was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and *began* to speak the word of God with boldness.
