II. You will face trials.

- A. Trials are the ordinary experience of believers living in a fallen world. Jo. 16:33
I Pe. 4:12-13 Job 5:7 Phil. 3:10 Col. 1:24 II Co. 4:8 Ps. 34:19a
- B. Believers in the Bible suffered great trials. Gen. 3:12 4:8ff 12:11ff 25:28ff 27:1ff
25:22 37:2ff I Sa. 2:12ff 8:3 II Sa. 12:10ff 13:1ff 15:1ff Eze 18:1ff Job 1:18-19 2:9
- C. We continue to endure significant trials.
- D. James does not say that we can, through faith and prayer, eliminate trials. v. 5-7
Job 5:7 Heb. 11:1ff Ezek. 18:1ff Luke 12:52-53
- E. Trials typically fall upon you unexpectedly (*encounter*). Luke 10:30

III. God is at work in your trials. 1:2-4

- A. *Consider it all joy* – It is vital for you to think correctly about your trials. I Pe. 1:6
 - 1. You can rejoice because God is in the picture. Think beyond your pain to the good our sovereign God is doing. Heb. 12:11 Ro. 8:28 Gen. 50:20
 - 2. What are some positive examples of those who had joy in their trials?

- B. God uses trials to help you to grow. v. 3 Ro. 5:2-4 I Pe. 1:6-7 Ps. 40:1-2 II Th. 1:3-4
 - 1. *Knowing* – You need to understand God’s purpose in your trials. Pr. 27:6 3:11-12
 - 2. *The testing of your faith* – Your trials prove and refine your faith. I Pe. 1:7 Ps. 12:6
 - 3. *Produces endurance* – Your trials produce needed steadfastness. Ro. 5:3 He. 12:11
Luke 8:15 II Thess. 1:4 Rev. 2:2 13:10 II Pe. 1:6 He. 11:37-39 II Co. 12:9f
- C. The end result of your trials is that you will be mature. v. 4 Mt. 5:48
 - 1. *Let endurance have its perfect result* -- Trials do not always and automatically produce endurance.
 - 2. In what sense can you become *perfect and complete*? v. 4,12 3:2 Mt. 5:48 19:21
Co. 1:28 4:12 I Th. 5:23 Phil. 3:15

IV. Ask God for wisdom in your trials. v. 5-8

- A. We especially need wisdom when facing trails. v. 5a 3:17 Prov. 1:2ff
- B. Ask God to give you the wisdom you need. v. 5a
 - 1. Admit that you lack wisdom. Mt. 5:3,6
 - 2. Seek wisdom as God’s great gift. Pr. 2:6 Rom. 11:33
 - 3. The wisdom we seek is embodied in the Person of Jesus Christ. I Co. 1:30 Co. 2:3
- C. God gladly gives His wisdom to all those who seek Him. Pr. 1:21ff 9:1ff 2:1ff
 - 1. James echos Jesus’ teaching. Mt. 7:7-11 John 14:13-14
 - 2. God gives generously. II Co. 8:2 9:11 Ro. 8:31ff Eph. 3:20-21 I Ki. 3:9ff
 - 3. He gives without reproach. Pr. 23:6-7 Ps. 103:13 Is. 55:6-9
 - 4. This is an absolute promise of God. Pr. 1:20ff John 7:37 Ps. 81:10

- D. How does God impart His wisdom? 1:18 Rom. 10:17 Ps. 1:2 Prov. 1:5**
1. Do not expect God to impart the skill of wisdom to you by zapping you.
 2. God uses His Word to make you wise. 1:18,21 Ro. 10:17 Ps. 1:1ff
- E. You must ask in faith. v. 6b-8**
1. What does it mean to ask in faith? Heb. 11:6 Mt. 21:22 Mark 11:24 Rom. 4:21
 2. What kind of doubt is James condemning? v. 6 Mt. 26:39 Mark 9:24

V. Never lose sight of God's goodness in your trials. v. v. 13-18,5

- A. Satan will tempt you to doubt God's goodness when you are enduring trials. Gen. 3:5**
- B. Don't blame God when you are tempted. v. 13**
- C. God is good. 1:17 Ps. 145:15-16,19 Mt. 5:45 Jo. 3:16 Acts 17:25**
1. He is the Father (Creator) of lights. Gen. 1:14ff Ps. 136:6-8 I Jo. 1:5 I Ti. 6:16
 2. He is immutably perfect in His goodness. v. 17d Mal. 3:6 I Jo. 1:5 Heb. 13:8 Ps. 18:30a 100:5 102:26-27 Is. 40:8
- D. God generously gives good gifts. v. 17, 5**
1. He is the source of every good gift. 4:4 3:15,17 1:5 Jo. 3:3,7,31,16 II Pe. 1:3-4
 2. God is good to everything and everyone, even His enemies. Mt. 5:45 6:26-30 Acts 14:17 Ps. 104:27-28 145:15-16
 3. His gifts are perfect (complete). 1:25 Deut. 32:4 Ps. 19:7
 4. God's best gifts are spiritual. 1:5 3:17 II Pe. 1:3-4 Col. 3:1-2 Mt. 7:11 Ro. 6:23 John 3:16 14:17 Ezek. 36:25-26 Ps. 19:7ff I Co. 10:13
- E. When you feel overwhelmed by trials and are tempted to doubt God's goodness, remember His good gifts. Rom. 8:31ff II Pe. 1:3-4 Pr. 18:22 19:14 I Thess. 5:18 I Tim. 4:4-5 Ps. 73:1,17ff 74:12ff 80:8ff**
