  - 3) There was only one ark. (John 14:6; Acts 4:12)
  - 4) There was only one door in the ark. (6:16; John 10:9)
  - 5) Both the ark and salvation were planned by God. (2 Timothy 1:9)
  - 6) Salvation is secured by God. (7:16; Hebrews 7:25)
  - 7) Salvation is offered to all who will repent and believe. (2 Peter 3:8-9)
  - 8) The invitation to be saved by God's grace will end. (6:3; 2 Corinthians 6:2)
  - 9) We have been saved from the wrath to come. (1 Thessalonians 1:9-10)
