God's Perspective On Sin

It didn't "just happen". It was evil in God's sight (11:27-12:6).

God's Perspective On Sin

God produced conviction of sin (12:7a).

God's Perspective On Sin

God rebuked David for discontentment with God's many kindnesses (12:7b-8).

God's Perspective On Sin

God rebuked David for despising His word and doing what is evil in His sight (12:9).

God's Perspective On Sin

God assigned consequences for David's sin (12:10-12; 14-23).

God's Perspective On Sin

God forgave David's sin (12:13).
