Acts 14:1-6	The church at Iconium	Paul and Barnabas	First Missionary Journey	"that a great multitude both of the Jews and also of the Greeks believed." (v.1b) "the brethren" (v.2)	
Acts 14:5-20	The church at Lystra	Paul and Barnabas	First Missionary Journey	"as the disciples" – apparently, they had converts in Lystra. (v.20) (Timothy, Acts 16:1 was one of the disciples).	
Acts 14:20-23	The church at Derbe	Paul and Barnabas	First Missionary Journey	"taught many" (discipled) (v.21)	Acts 14:22 Confirming the souls of the disciples, and exhorting them to continue in the faith, and that we must through much tribulation enter into the kingdom of God. 23 And when they had ordained them elders in every church, and had prayed with fasting, they commended them to the Lord, on whom they believed.
