I. Looking for Loopholes
A. Five Excuses to Not Forgive
Matthew 18:21-22 (NASB)
Then Peter came and said to Him, "Lord, how often shall my brother sin against me and I forgive him? Up to seven times?" Jesus said* to him, "I do not say to you, up to seven times, but up to seventy times seven.
1. The hurt is too big. I can't possibly forgive something that big.
"Are you being destroyed by a massive injury caused by another that you won't let go of? The bigger it is, the harder you fall." P.James MacDonald-
2. I can't forgive until I forget.
This is called "cherishing the hurt."
