

# "Hurdles of Hospitality"

Issues that Isolate Genesis 43:15-34

#### Fearing:

I. Injury - "and fall upon us" (vs. 15-23)
Challenges Your Courage
Risk being:

- A. Compromised "seek occasion against us"
- **B.** Conscripted " take us for bondmen"
- C. Confiscated "and (take) our asses"

II. Inquiry - "Is this your younger brother?" (vs. 24-31)
Challenges Your Compassion
Respond with:

- A. Benevolence "gave them water, ...their asses provender"
  Real help....cost money
- B. Blessing "God be gracious unto thee, my son"
  Real Encouragement ....cost words
- C. Bowels "his bowels did yearn upon his brother"
  Real Support...cost emotions

III. Inequity- "he took and sent messes unto them" (vs. 32-34)
Challenges your Contentment
Revealing:

- A. Prejudice "Egyptians...not eat bread with the Hebrews"
- **B.** Position "according to his birthright and...to his youth"
- C. Privilege "Benjamin's mess was five times... as any"

### Sentence Sermon:

"Christian Hospitality is extending God's welcome by making people feel at home in our lives."
