I. Introduction and review.

II. Hold marriage in high honor. v. 4a

- A. The theology of sex: Sexual purity is a matter of covenant.
 - 1. God deals with us through covenant. 8:7ff
 - 2. Marriage is a lifelong covenant of companionship between one man and one woman. Gen. 2:18-25
 - 3. Sexual expression is to take place exclusively within the covenant of marriage.
 - 4. Marriage is designed by God as a picture of His relationship to us. Eph. 5:22ff
 - 5. Sexual union in marriage is a symbol of the intimate spiritual relationship between Christ and the church.
 - 6. To be unfaithful to your marriage is to imply that Jesus would be unfaithful to His covenant bride.
 - 7. Sexual sin is sin against God. Gen. 39:9 Ps. 51:4
- B. Marriage, therefore, is honorable (precious and valuable). I Pe. 1:19 I Co. 3:12
 - 1. God honors marriage. Gen. 2:18ff John 2
 - 2. The marriage bed is honorable and is to be kept pure. Gen. 2:24 1:28 Pr. 5:15ff
 - 3. Virtually every culture acknowledges the value of marriage.
- C. In what ways can we positively show that we value marriage? Eph. 5:22ff
 - 1. Invest in your own marriage so that it will display God's ideals. Phil. 2:3f
 - 2. Respect the marriages of others.
 - 3. Be pure before you are married and don't even consider marrying someone who doesn't share your faith and your ideals about marriage. I Cor. 7:39 II Co. 6:14ff

III. How do some dishonor and defile marriage?

- A. Some dishonor marriage by implying that celibacy is a more holy state. <u>I Tim. 4:3-5</u> Mark 1:30 Mt. 1:24 <u>I Co. 9:5</u> 7:3-5 I Ti. 3:2ff Jo. 7:3 Pr. 5:18-19 Song of Solomon
- B. Some dishonor marriage by breaking their marriage covenant (divorce). Mt. 5:32 19:9 Mal. 2:16
- C. Some dishonor marriage by not investing the time, love, and effort required into their own marriage. Eph. 5:22ff
- D. Some dishonor marriage by denying the distinctiveness of how God has made us as male and female. Gen. 1:27
- E. Some dishonor marriage by redefining marriage to include the union of two men or two women. Lev. 18:22 20:13 Rom. 1:26-27
- F. Some dishonor marriage through marital unfaithfulness (adultery). Ex. 20:14
 - 1. Adultery breaks the marriage covenant and is grounds for divorce. Mt. 5:32 19:9
 - 2. Jesus taught that lust is adulterous. Mt. 5:28
- G. Some dishonor marriage through partaking of its privileges (sexual union) before the marriage covenant has been made (fornication). 12:16 I Co. 5:9-11 6:9 Eph. 5:3,5 I Th. 4:3-7 Rev. 21:8 22:15

IV. God will judge fornicators and adulterers.

- A. Sexual sin is deceitful. 3:13 Prov. 7:15ff I Co. 6:16,18-20 Num. 32:23 I Th. 4:6 Js. 1:14ff Pr. 30:20
- B. Sexual immorality has immediate consequences.
 - 1. You will harm your relationship with God. Ps. 32:2-4
 - 2. You will harm yourself personally. Ro. 1:27 Prov. 6:26ff 7:22ff
 - 3. You will harm the other people involved. I Co. 13:5-6
 - 4. You will harm your relationship with your spouse (or your future spouse).
 - 5. You may harm your children. II Sam. 13 16:20-21
 - 6. You will harm the church body. I Co. 5:6
 - 7. You will harm your testimony to the lost.
- C. The ultimate consequence is everlasting judgment. 9:27 10:30 12:29 Eph. 5:5-6 Col. 3:5 I Cor. 6:9-10 Rev. 21:8 22:15 Dt. 22:20-22 Pr. 5:20-23 6:24-35 7:22-27 2:19
- D. Resist sexual temptation. II Tim. 2:22 Gen. 39:12
 - 1. Don't be like Esau who chose this present world and rejected God. 12:16f
 - 2. Don't play with sexual temptation. Prov. 5:8
 - 3. See sexual immorality the way God sees it. Pr. 2:16-19

V. Concluding applications: Sexual purity is a matter of faith.

- A. Faith frees you from the guilt of past sinful failures. 11:31 10:10,14,18 <u>I Co. 6:9-11</u> John 8:1-11 Ps. 32:1ff,51
- B. By faith you are transformed into a new person. I Co. 6:9-11 II Co. 5:17 Rom. 6:1ff
- C. Ongoing sexual purity is a battle for faith. 11:1-2,6 I Th. 4:3-8 Ro. 14:23
 - 1. The world and the flesh tell you to follow your feelings and pursue pleasure
 - 2. By faith we know that God's good gift of sex is exclusively for marriage.
 - 3. By faith we trust God to meet our needs in His way and time. v. 5b-6 Phil. 4:11ff
