- **1.** AFTER HELL CAME TO THE CROSS, JESUS THE CHRIST OFFERED UP HIS SPIRIT AND DIED (27:46-50).
 - a. Jesus' cry of abandonment arose from Psalm 22: "My God, My God why hast thou forsaken me" (Mat 27:46; Psa 22:1, 11-19).
 - (1) The Roman soldiers gambling for His clothes: "They part my garments among them, and cast lots upon my vesture" (Psa 22:18)
 - (2) The passersby mocking and shaking their heads at Him: "All they that see me laugh me to scorn: they shoot out the lip, they shake the head" (22:7)
 - (3) The mockery of the chief priests, scribes, and others: "He trusted on the LORD that he would deliver him: let him deliver him, seeing he delighted in him" (22:8)
 - b. Bystanders thought that Jesus cried out for Elijah (27:47).
 - c. Jesus cried out in physical anguish (Joh 19:28).

2. APPLICATIONS:

- (1) Christ's cry of abandonment reveals His great love for His Father and His people.
- (2) Christ's cry of physical anguish reveals His great love for His Father and His people.
