You will learn all this and more when you join us for a special day trip to Stockbridge, MA, one of the Berkshires' most charming towns with a rich artistic and colonial history. We will learn about this highly influential revivalist preacher, philosopher, and theologian. In the morning we will visit the Edwards Sundial, the Children's Chimes Tower, the Mission House, the Edwards "rotating desk" at the Stockbridge Library Museum, the pink granite Edward's Monument, and the First Congregational Church of Stockbridge, all with Dr. Paul Hoehner as our guide. In the afternoon we will have time for lunch and sightseeing in the historic downtown. Some may want to visit the Norman Rockwell Museum.



We will meet at the Woodstock Union High School parking lot on the morning of Saturday, August 26. Psalm 86:1-17

The Song of the Weak

1. Let Us Learn with David in the School of Prayer.

2. Let Us Deepen Our Intimacy with God through Prayer.

3. Let Us See Ourselves More Accurately through Prayer.

4. Let Us Trust Messiah Together in Prayer.

Conclusion: God has given us this song to sing to Him as an expression of faith. As we turn to Him in our distress we learn more what it means to trust Him above all else. We also discover that both our knowledge of Him and ourselves grow through this exercise of faith. This in turn leads us to trust Him more together as a community because of His faithfulness in providing us Messiah.

Acts 16:23-25

After they had been severely flogged, they were thrown into prison, and the jailer was commanded to guard them carefully. When he received these orders, he put them in the inner cell and fastened their feet in the stocks. About midnight Paul and Silas were *praying and singing hymns to God*, and the other prisoners were listening to them.

First Corinthians 14:15-17

So what shall I do? *I will pray* with my spirit, but I will also *pray* with my understanding; I will *sing* with my spirit, but I will also *sing* with my understanding. Otherwise, when you are praising God in the Spirit, how can someone else, who is now put in the position of an inquirer, say "Amen" to your thanksgiving, since they do not know what you are saying? You are giving thanks well enough, but no one else is edified.

First Thessalonians 1:4-10

⁴ For we know, *brothers loved by God*, that he has chosen you, ⁵ because our gospel came to you not only in word, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction. You know what kind of men we proved to be among you for your sake. ⁶ And *you became imitators of us and of the Lord*, for you received the word in much affliction, with the joy of the Holy Spirit, ⁷ so that *you became an example to all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia*. ⁸ For not only has the word of the Lord sounded forth from you in Macedonia and Achaia, but *your faith in God* has gone forth everywhere, so that we need not say anything. ⁹ For they themselves report concerning us the kind of reception we had among you, and how *you turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God*, ¹⁰ and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead, Jesus who delivers us from the wrath to come.

James 5:13-16

Is anyone among you in trouble? Let them *pray*. Is anyone happy? Let them *sing songs of praise*. Is anyone among you sick? Let them call the elders of the church to pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord. And the *prayer offered in faith* will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise them up. If they have sinned, they will be forgiven. Therefore, *confess your sins to each other and pray for each other* so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective.

Romans 12:3-8

For by the grace given me I say to every one of you: Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the faith God has distributed to each of you. For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith; if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully.

Taking Gathered Worship Home

David has been anointed, he was God's chosen king, and yet he was besieged and downcast. His song sung in weakness to the mighty God helps us to understand how we too can trust in our covenant-keeping God. Not just because David did so, but because the same God he could trust is the God who has shown Himself faithful as our God too.

Please use the devotional material below each day this week to praise Christ. Ask Jesus to teach us His ways that we may walk in them to accomplish His purposes.

READ Psalm 86:1-17; 28:1-9; 40:1-17; 70:1-5; 109:1-31; Acts 16:23-25; First Corinthians 14:15-17; First Thessalonians 1:4-10; James 5:13-16; Romans 12:3-8. DISCUSS In what ways are you "poor and needy" today? Why? How is God's character your great comfort? MEDITATE on Philippians 1:18b-21. PRAY "Lord, You have displayed Your character on the cross. Teach us to trust in You."

Monday

READ Psalm 86:1-17; Acts 16:23-25; First Corinthians 14:15-17; Psalm 28:1-9. DISCUSS What did Paul and Silas do in prison? Why? How did that demonstrate faith in God? SERVE by taking time to help someone! MEDITATE on Philippians 1:18b-21. PRAY, "Father God, You are faithful throughout generations; enable us to trust in You."

Tuesday

READ Psalm 86:1-17; First Corinthians 14:15-17; First Thessalonians 1:4-10; Psalm 40:1-17. DISCUSS How do song and prayer demonstrate faith? How can you sing in your circumstance? MEDITATE on Philippians 1:18b-21. PRAY, "O Lord, our God, You alone are God. We praise You for Your matchless faithfulness. Make us more and more like Christ in our faithfulness to You."

Wednesday

READ Psalm 86:1-17; Psalm 70:1-5; First Thessalonians 1:4-10; James 5:13-16. DISCUSS How can we respond like our brothers and sisters in Thessalonica? What was it about their faith that was commendable? Why? MEDITATE on Philippians 1:18b-21. PRAY, "O Lord, You alone are worthy of all praise. Thank You for the gift of faith with which we might praise You."

Thursday

READ Psalm 86:1-17; James 5:13-16; Romans 12:3-8; Psalm 109:1-31. DISCUSS How are we to view ourselves rightly? SERVE by putting someone else's interests *above your own*! MEDITATE on **Philippians** 1:18b-21. PRAY, "Our Great God, empower us to live by faith in You and so encourage one another to do the same."

Friday

READ Psalm 86:1-17; 28:1-9; 40:1-17; 70:1-5; 109:1-31; Acts 16:23-25; First Corinthians 14:15-17; First Thessalonians 1:4-10; James 5:13-16; Romans 12:3-8. DISCUSS What has God been teaching you this week? SERVE by *caring for someone in need!* MEDITATE on Philippians 1:18b-21. PRAY that we at FCCW would *trust Christ together*.

Saturday

PREPARE today for gathered Sunday worship tomorrow. CONSIDER What can you do today to be better prepared for gathering with God's people tomorrow? READ **Psalm 34:1-22**. Invite others to join you tomorrow for the worship service @ 9:30 am. PRAY, "Lord, prepare Your people for Your praises. Gather us together to delight in You."

Philippians 1:18b-21
