ORDER OF WORSHIP

Thank you for joining us this morning! At Christ the King, our worship is a divine-human dialogue, in accordance with Scriptural example and precedent, alternatively hearing God's Word and responding in prayer, song, or meditation. Call to Worship

This psalm is uniquely appropriate for a call to worship today, because of the various elements it contains, which mesh with the themes of our sermon text. It enjoins us to praise God for the fact that He is the transcendent source of all our blessings (w. 1-6). It then calls us to thank Him for His abundant goodness (benefits bestowed on all His creatures), based on His **steadfast love** (Hebrew "hesed"; w. 7-11). Finally, it calls for praise from His people, rehearsing His blessings to them, culminating in the mention of the gracious revelation of His Law (w. 12-20).

Prayer of Adoration and Invocation

The name of Jehovah (actually "Yahweh," as we have seen) we now praise, call each other to praise, and rejoice in its eventual universal praise among all His creatures.

WE ACKNOWLEDGE OUR SIN

* Reading from the Law

The imperative in this story is that we must relate to the name of Jesus in the proper way, that is, **covenantally**. The power of Jesus' name is a blessing only to those who commit themselves to Him in faith as Lord. His name is never a magical incantation that can be gratuitously used to obtain power for ourselves.

Acts 19:11-20 ESV

And God was doing extraordinary miracles by the hands of Paul, ¹² so that even handkerchiefs or aprons that had touched his skin were carried away to the sick, and their diseases left them and the evil spirits came out of them. ¹³ Then some of the itinerant Jewish exorcists undertook to invoke the name of the Lord Jesus over those who had

evil spirits, saying, "I adjure you by the Jesus whom Paul proclaims." ¹⁴ Seven sons of a Jewish high priest named Sceva were doing this. ¹⁵ But the evil spirit answered them, "Jesus I know, and Paul I recognize, but who are you?" ¹⁶ And the man in whom was the evil spirit leaped on them, mastered all of them and overpowered them, so that they fled out of that house naked and wounded. ¹⁷ And this became known to all the residents of Ephesus, both Jews and Greeks. And fear fell upon them all, and the name of the Lord Jesus was extolled. ¹⁸ Also many of those who were now believers came, confessing and divulging their practices. ¹⁹ And a number of those who had practiced magic arts brought their books together and burned them in the sight of all. And they counted the value of them and found it came to fifty thousand pieces of silver. ²⁰ So the word of the Lord continued to increase and prevail mightily.

Silent Confession of Sin

Corporate Confession of Sin

We **take courage** to seek the mercy of the Lord, because of the revelation to us that He is a gracious God who desires our salvation, and will give it to all who seek Him in faith. We also acknowledge that He does this for the glory of His Name, in which we who have been saved exult.

O eternal God and merciful Father, we humble ourselves before Your great Majesty against which we have frequently and grievously sinned. We acknowledge that we deserve nothing less than eternal death. We are unclean before You and children of wrath. We continually transgress Your commandments; failing to do what You have commanded us, and doing that which You have expressly forbidden. We all like sheep have gone astray; we have turned everyone to his own way. We acknowledge our waywardness, and are heartily sorry for all our sins. We confess to our humiliation and to the praise of Your mercy that our transgressions are innumerable, and that our debt is so great that we cannot even begin to repay. We are not worthy to be called Your children, nor to lift up our eyes heavenward to You in prayer.

Nevertheless, O Lord God and gracious Father, we know that You do not desire the death of the sinner, but rather that he should turn to You and live; we know that Your mercy toward those who turn to You is infinite; and so we take courage to call upon You from the depths of our hearts, trusting in our Mediator Jesus Christ, the

Lamb of God Who takes away the sin of the world. Forgive all our sins for Christ's sake. Have compassion upon us in our infirmities. Wash us in the pure fountain of His blood, so that we may become clean and white as snow. Cover us with His innocence and righteousness, for the glory of Your Name. Deliver our understanding from all blindness, and our hearts from all willfulness and rebellion. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

WE REJOICE IN THE ASSURANCE OF FORGIVENESS

Assurance of Pardoning Grace

You might think, at first glance, that this passage is not an expression of the gospel as you have understood it. Yet the gospel, as we have seen many times before, is the gospel of the Kingdom, which is the emphasis of this passage as the "good news" about the eventual recognition that Jesus is Lord, and that this is the name He has inherited as a man for us. In the first place, the gospel is the announcement of the historical events through which this is established, which form the content of this passage.

Philippians 2:5-11 ESV

Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, ⁶ who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, ⁷ but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. ⁸ And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. ⁹ Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Leader: This is the gospel.

Congregation: Hallelujah!

The revelation of God's holiness leads us to an awareness of our uncleanness and sin. The revelation of His love and mercy leads us to seek reconciliation through His grace.

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Prayers of Intercession

Distribution of Elements

For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles.
