I. Faith brings peace: vs. 1-3

- A. Where do wars and fightings among you come from?
 - 1. The war in verse 1 is the overall (total) conflict.
 - 2. Fightings are the individual battles.
 - 3. Wars and battles come from a war of lusts in our members (our bodies).
 - 4. There is a conflict between the natural man and the spiritual man.

Paul said: Romans 7:24, 25

- 24 O wretched man that I am! who shall deliver me from the body of this death?
 25 I thank God through Jesus Christ our Lord. So then with the mind I myself serve the law of God; but with the flesh the law of sin.
- B. We don't have what we want, because we leave God out of our lives: vs. 2, 3
 - 1. We desire or lust, but we have not.
 - 2. We put forth fleshly effort, but we fail to get what we want.
 - 3. Why? We must ask God in faith (believing) for those things we want.
 - 4. We must ask for the right reason not to consume it on ourselves our lusts
- C. James warns against friendship with the world: vs. 4, 5
 - The world has never been a friend to God.
 - 2. To be a friend of the world is to be an enemy of God.
 - The Scripture is our source of truth.
- D. To whom does God give His grace? vs. 6 8
 - 1. God resists the proud; God gives grace to those who are humble.
 - 2. God gives His grace to the humble.
 - 3. God admonishes us. We do not have an option: vs. 7 12
 - a. Submit yourself to God. Resist the devil. v. 7
 - b. Draw nigh (near) to God. Cleanse your hands. Purify your hearts. v. 8
 - c. Humble yourself before God. vs. 9, 10
 - d. Don't judge your Christian brother. v. 11
 - e. Only God is qualified to judge. Only God is able to save. Only God is able to destroy. v. 12

II. Depend on God: vs. 13 - 15

- A. Make plans based on God's will. Include God in all of your plans! v. 13
- B. You don't know the future. v. 14
- C. We must answer the question, "What is your life?"
 - 1. It is a vapor
 - 2. It appears for a little while.
 - 3. It vanishes away and after this the judgment.
 - 4. We should seek the will of God in everything we do.
 - 1 Peter 1:24, 25
 - 24 For all flesh is as grass, and all the glory of man as the flower of grass. The grass withereth, and the flower thereof falleth away:
 - 25 But the word of the Lord endureth for ever. And this is the word which by the gospel is preached unto you.
- D. There is a sin of omission (leaving something out; undone): vs. 16, 17
 - 1. God can be left out of your life. God does not force you to do right.
 - 2. We know God.
 - 3. Do good.
