Intro:

Last of this mini-series. Use of Law after the Fall for the redeemed. <u>READ WLC Q&A 97.</u> Notice, LC: "Although they that are regenerate, and believe in Christ" – Not how to get life, but live life given to you.

Main Point of Text: The saving grace of God teaches Christians how to live until Christ returns.

<u>Sermon Point:</u> Give thanks through good works.

Move 1: Give thanks that your works are no longer measured under the Covenant of Works. LC: "be delivered from the moral law as a covenant of works":

- READ Romans 6:14; 7:4-6. The Law changes in application upon you and your works.
- ... God sent forth his Son, made of a woman, <u>made under the law, To redeem them that were under the law,</u> that we might receive the adoption of sons. (Galatians 4:4-5)

Move 2: Give thanks that your worthiness before God is not measured by your works.

LC: "so as thereby they are neither justified nor condemned": For obedience/violation.

- Therefore by the deeds of the law there shall no flesh be justified in his sight: for by the law is the knowledge of sin. (Rom 3:20). Can't be justified, don't try. Also, can't be condemned, don't worry.
- Focus on the fruits of the Spirit ... Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law. (Gal 5:23)

Move 3: Give thanks to Jesus Christ for living the Law and paying its penalty for you.

LC: "yet, besides the general uses thereof common to them with all men, it is of special use, to show them how much they are bound to Christ for his <u>fulfilling it</u>, <u>and enduring the curse</u> thereof in their stead, and for their good": Active and passive obedience of Christ involved in your salvation/eternal life.

- READ Romans 7:24 8:4. See your benefit being in union with Jesus Christ who fulfilled the Law.
- READ Galatians 2:13-14. Seeing your benefit of being crucified in Christ.

Move 4: Be thankful to Jesus. Be thankful more and more!

LC: "and thereby to provoke them to more thankfulness":

- What is Zechariah's prophecy about the effect of Messiah's coming? <u>READ Luke 1:68-69, 74-75</u>
- <u>READ Colossians 1:9-14.</u> If we answer, "How are you?" with "Better than I deserve." Let not be with an ellipsis, but with an exclamation point! Followed by "Hallelujah" and "Thank You Jesus!"
- LC: "provoke". Greek: incite/irritate. May you and I break out in a holy riot and rash.
- *And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works:* (Heb. 10:24).

Move 5: Be showy about your thankfulness.

LC: "and to express the same": For <u>I delight</u> in the law of God after the inward man: (Rom 7:22). We wear thankfulness on our faces. And on our arms and legs.

LC: "in their greater care to conform themselves thereunto as the rule of their obedience". Titus 2:11-14:

- Grace of God (vs. 11) doesn't just save. <u>Vs. 12</u>: Shows how to serve. Grace saves and guides life.
- How? <u>Vs. 12. Negatively</u>: disregard the impieties of eager earthly passions. Romans 12:2 be not conformed to this world. <u>Positively</u>: Be self-controlled and live justly in a godly matter with regard for God's Law because of Gods Savior. Romans 12:2 be ye transformed by the renewing of mind.
- What for?: Vs. 12: that we might live in the "now" age (lit. Greek). For a coming age: Vs. 13.
- <u>Vs. 14:</u> ransom: redeem by purchase (He owns us). From lawlessness (no law, Greek). That He (vs. 13, Savior) might cleanse us for Himself. To be Peculiar. Zealots (lit. Greek) for good works.
