Prelude

* Reading from the Law

God commands strict measures to prevent the spread of infectious contamination, in this passage in houses, the contamination being a figure of sin and its corrupting and spreading effects. Thus this passage is instructive on how God deals with sin in our lives, and how He wants us to deal with it.

Leviticus 14:34-45 ESV

⁴³ "If the disease breaks out again in the house, after he has taken out the stones and scraped the house and plastered it, ⁴⁴ then the priest shall go and look. And if the disease has spread in the house, it is a persistent leprous disease in the house; it is unclean. ⁴⁵ And he shall break down the house, its stones and timber and all the plaster of the house, and he shall carry them out of the city to an unclean place.

Corporate Confession of Sin

We might well be fearful when we become aware of the depth of our sin, but when we express our fears and confess our sins, as we do now in this hymn, we receive God's comfort and healing grace, and it is good to sing of that as well.

The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.

Distribution of Elements

Because we believe that wine was used in the Last Supper and is thus more in accord with the fullness of symbolism intended by God in the Lord's Supper, we offer wine and encourage those who take part in Communion to take this. For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer the option of grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles of the trays.
