ROMANS 5:12-21

Therefore, just as through one man sin entered into the world, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men, because all sinned for until the Law sin was in the world, but sin is not imputed when there is no law.

Nevertheless death reigned from Adam until Moses, even over those who had not sinned in the likeness of the offense of Adam, who is a type of Him who was to come. But the free gift is not like the transgression. For if by the transgression of the one the many died, much more did the grace of God and the gift by the grace of the one Man, Jesus Christ, abound to the many.

The gift is not like that which came through the one who sinned; for on the one hand the judgment arose from one transgression resulting in condemnation, but on the other hand the free gift arose from many transgressions resulting in justification.

For if by the transgression of the one, death reigned through the one, much more those who receive the abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness will reign in life through the One, Jesus Christ. So then as through one transgression there resulted condemnation to all men, even so through one act of righteousness there resulted justification of life to all men.

For as through the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, even so through the obedience of the One the many will be made righteous.

The Law came in so that the transgression would increase; but where sin increased, grace abounded all the more, so that, as sin reigned in death, even so grace would reign through righteousness to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

THROUGH ONE MAN!!!

- The fact of Adamic Guilt, 5:12.
 - Note that...
 - ✓ Adam was real!
 - ✓ The "Fall" was real.
 - ✓ There was no sin before the Fall.
 - ✓ There was no death before the Fall.
 - ✓ The Genesis account is TRUE!!!

- The participation in Adamic Guilt, 5:12-14.
 In God's sight, we all participated in Adam's sin!
 - Compare Hebrews 7:9-10
 - ➤ Recall God visiting the sins of fathers to the 3rd and 4th generation, Exod. 20:5; 34:7

The contrasts with Adamic Guilt, 5:14-19.

Adam is a "type" of Christ!

He is a representative of a race of people, such that his act is imputed to the whole race.

Transgression

Death Reigned!

- The One, Jesus Christ
- Those who receive the abundance of grace & gift of righteousness
- Reign in life!

- The contrasts with Adamic Guilt, 5:18.
 - One Transgression
 - Condemnation to "all men!"

- One act of righteousness
- Justification of life to "all men."

- The contrasts with Adamic Guilt, 5:19.
 - One Man's disobedience

"The many" were made sinners "The many" will be made righteous This sounds like it is teaching universal salvation
In verses 15 and 19 you have "the many"
(Greek: "hoi polloi" [οὶ πολλοὶ] on both sides of the contrast. Are they the same?
Then in verse 18, you have "all men," (Greek:

Then in verse 18, you have "all men," (Greek: "pantas anthropous" [πάντας ἀνθρώπους] on both sides of the contrast. Are they the same??

There is no "universalism," because the phrase, "those who receive the abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness," in verse 17, implicitly qualifies the group in the second half of those contrasts.

Underline that phrase!!

Notice that in Christ, Adamic sin is overcome!

- V. 15, "...much more...abound...."
- V. 17, "...much more...."
- V. 20, "...where sin increased, grace superabounded all the more!"
