Leader: Which is the fourth commandment?

People: The fourth commandment is, Remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy. Six days shalt thou labor, and do all thy work: but the seventh day is the Sabbath of the LORD thy God: in it thou shalt not do any work, thou, nor thy son, nor thy daughter, thy manservant, nor thy maidservant, nor thy cattle, nor thy stranger that is within thy gates: For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them is, and rested the seventh day: wherefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day, and hallowed it. (Shorter Catechism 57)

Corporate Confession of Sin

Leader: Lord God of Hosts, Creator of heaven and earth and all that is in them, we confess that we have failed to remember your Sabbath and keep it holy.

People: We confess that we have not practiced holy resting on your Sabbath day, and gone about our worldly work and worries, doing what is sinful, profaning your day with idleness and with unnecessary thoughts and worries about our worldly work.

All: Grant us forgiveness, we pray, and teach us to follow your wise and holy example in setting aside one day in seven as a day of rest, blessed by you.
