

Names and Characteristics of the Dispensations

1. Innocence

- Revelation: Genesis 1:28-3:6
- Focus: Adam
- Responsibility/test: Name the animals, dress and keep the garden, fellowship with God, don't eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil
- Failure: They ate from the tree
- Judgment: Removed from the garden; death (physical & spiritual)

Names and Characteristics of the Dispensations

2. Conscience

- Revelation: Genesis 4:1-8:14
- Focus: All of mankind from Adam to Noah's family
- Changes: Man's conscience, death
- Responsibility/test: Maintain moral uprightness based upon the knowledge of good and evil (conscience); do good
- Failure: absolute corruption and violence from the inside of man manifested on the outside all over the world.
- Judgment: The flood

Names and Characteristics of the Dispensations

3. Human (civil) Government

- Revelation: Genesis 8:15-11:9
- Focus: All of mankind from Noah to Abraham
- Changes: Relationship with animals (food), death penalty
- Responsibility/test: Man to replenish the earth, take dominion and govern one another (protect life) while staying connected with God.
- Failure: Noah's vineyard, the tower of babel
- Judgment: God refocused on Abraham

Names and Characteristics of the Dispensations

4. Promise (Patriarch)

- Revelation: Genesis 11:10 Exodus 18:27
- Focus: Abraham and his descendants
- Changes: Focus on one family instead of all men
- Responsibility/test: Believe and obey God, stay in the promised land
- Failure: Israel and his children moving to Egypt
- Judgment: Bondage to Egypt

Names and Characteristics of the Dispensations

5. Law (Mosaic Law)

- Revelation: Exodus 19:1 Matthew 3:1 (Luke 16:16 "until John")
- Focus: Israel
- Changes: Change of focus, written rules given (law)
- Responsibility/test: Keep the law and walk with God
- Failure: Israel consistently disobeys the law and forsakes God for idols
- Judgment: Captivities/bondages: (judges period, kings, Assyria, Babylon, Meads/Persians, Greeks, Romans)

Names and Characteristics of the Dispensations

6. Grace

- Revelation: Matthew 3:1 Revelation 19:21
- Focus: Church (primarily gentiles)
- Changes: Law fulfilled, vale rent, direct access to God, grace, indwelling of the Holy Ghost
- Responsibility/test: Believe on Christ, walk with Him and accomplish the great commission
- Failure: the world fails to turn to God in Christ and Christians fail to accomplish the great commission
- Judgment: death, loss of reward, the tribulation

Names and Characteristics of the Dispensations

7. Millennium

- Revelation: Revelation 20:1-20:15
- Focus: The Kingdom
- Changes: The curse is cancelled, Christ reigns on earth
- Responsibility/test: Believe on Christ, submit to His government
- Failure: many follow satan at the end of the 1,000 years
- Judgment: death, final judgment (great white throne)

Names and Characteristics of the Dispensations

Carryovers


- 1. Promises
- 2. Things that start in one dispensation and continue into the rest
- 3. Things instituted in one dispensation increasing in the next (death penalty, laws into grace, etc.)
- 4. Commands re-incorporated
- 5. Some things cancelled (food, circumcision, sabbath, etc.)


