2118 - LOOKING to JESUS - Heb 12.1-3

PRELIMS. The gospel is <u>not only</u> for unbelievers - it is for **believers** it is the answer for **everyone** in all situations and conditions! When an unbeliever **sins**, he needs to **repent** and come to Christ! Right? When a believer sins - what? He needs to **repent** and come to Christ again. There is a **continual** coming to X for believers

This Writer is writing to Jews who **have already come** to Christ. There is no question but he is writing believers in Christ. They *share in Christ* [3:14] and he calls them *holy brothers* and *beloved* [6:9]. And he has **encouraged** them to *draw near* (again) *with a true heart...sprinkled clean* by the blood of Christ in *the new and living way that He opened for us* [10:22]. The whole Bible teaches this. The Apostle **Peter** expects his readers to be <u>continually coming</u> to Christ *if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good.* (*unto whom coming* **AV**) *As you <u>come</u> to Him* [present middle participle, 1P2:4]

In fact this Writer has already reminded his readers of God's Throne of Grace *Let us then with confidence <u>draw near</u> to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need* [4:16] Isn't Christ the One who bestows grace to us! Wasn't this the **problem** with **Esau**! He found **no place to <u>repent</u>![17]**. He did not know about the throne of grace! He knew of **no place** where there is **free grace**. **APP** Don't <u>you</u> come regularly for grace?

You see the **gospel** is <u>not</u> reforming our prayer life or becoming more sincere in our efforts at religious duties, or having more and longer 'quiet times'! The gospel is <u>not</u> about **doing** things - it is about <u>receiving</u> the <u>grace</u> of God through Christ and to restore us again in favour with God again! The Throne of grace is the place where we receive grace - the gospel is <u>coming</u> to Christ in confession and <u>receiving</u> His pardon! Thus *how shall we escape if* <u>we neglect</u> such a great salvation?[2:3] - a salvation still ongoing!

This whole Book is about Jewish **believers** who are still **falling short**! He has several severe **warnings** for them. If they **remain** unrepentant *there no longer remains a sacrifice* for their sins [10:26] +*Take care, brothers, lest there be in any of you an evil unbelieving heart, leading you to fall away from the living God* [3:12]+*let us fear* *lest any of you should seem to have failed to reach it* (My rest) [4:1]. And of course **rest** is what these readers are **longing** for - *so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted* [3b] They are getting weary and tired. They are under **pressure** for they have *not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood* [4] There are more struggles to come!

And so, how does the Writer get them to endure? How does he encourage them? Does he tell them to **try harder** to do the right things? No, they are doing the right things. Does he tell them to **examine** their **attitudes** and **motives** in their good works? No, he doesn't. Does he offer them a <u>list</u> of **rules and principles** for **selfimprovement**, or a <u>build yourself up programme</u>? Not at all!

You see, so many of our TV Evangelists do little more than offer a list of 'do's and 'don't's in order to gain **fulfilment** and a **more enjoyable life**! Many evangelists <u>address</u> and <u>cater</u> for those who are <u>looking</u> for a **happier life**, a 'feel better' programme and a 'feel more confident' personality. They think that is what people want! And they are right!! That is what people and Xns do want !

An the trouble is that too many sermons (which I have preached too) are, when analysed, no more than a programme to make us **feel better** about ourselves! But the **gospel** my friends is **not** about **you/I** feeling good about ourselves - the gospel is about **receiving grace** for the **forgiveness** of our sins and receiving **strength** to worship God in **all things**. It is about **changing** our relationship with God from being sinners, to being sinners **saved by grace living for Him!**

Learn this: Jesus Christ **has accomplished** all that you/I need **to do**! You will <u>never feel good</u> about your keeping of God's law - or about your **motives** or **sincerity** - because you are totally unable to keep God's law fully and properly! You will **always fail**. Xnity is <u>not</u> for **perfectionists!** The **gospel** is an **announcement** that Jesus has kept all that **for <u>you</u>**! So you **ought** to be absolutely **delighted** and <u>relieved</u> - and <u>revived</u> so you can serve God as best you can.

When we fall short of what God asks of us, we **feel guilty because** we are concerned about our feelings, and too often we swim in a sea of **narcissism!** Ie, we are **full of ourselves** and look **inward** and at how we **compare** with other people! We are truly **self-centred**! It

was the same with the people in the Book of Hebrews addressed! So what does the Writer do here? The Writer in recognising their weakness tells them they **lost sight** of Jesus Christ *the founder and perfector* of their *faith* [2] Their eyes 'slipped' off the very One who saved them! They are <u>not</u> like their heroes in chapter 11 who focussed their faith, not on themselves but on God in Christ. So he points them to **Christ** - *looking to Jesus*.... *Consider Him* [2,3]! That is why he began his letter focussing immediately on X!

By the way, many of these self-help programmes <u>are</u> good - but you can do them without Jesus! Many people can stop drinking, become more disciplined, perform more good works and improve their marriage - without God or Jesus Christ! Non-Xns can do many wonderful things! What we believers need to do, is to do it <u>for</u> and <u>because</u> of Jesus Christ. To give glory to Him in doing things! Feeling better may be a side effect - but the main reason is to please Him who saved us. After stating that we walk by faith and not by sight, Paul says whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to <u>please Him</u> [2C5:9] Our Writer just said that Enoch had pleased God. And without faith it is impossible to <u>please</u> Him [11:5,6]

The **most common** thing which causes Xns to **backslide** and to **lose sight** of Jesus, is <u>problems/difficulties/sufferings</u> in the way! Xns, as well as unbelievers, <u>do wonder why</u> problems/pains arise at the most inconvenient of times! But coping with suffering <u>is</u> the Xn path. We have been **chosen** to go along that road. If the Perfect Son of God, the Holy One who fully pleased God, was **subject** to suffering and difficulties, **why** are we **amazed** that problems come our way?

Friends, as Xns, we should <u>rejoice</u> when suffering comes. Enduring suffering makes you **stronger/better!** *Count it all joy my brothers when you meet trials of various kinds, for you <u>know</u> that the <u>testing</u> <i>of your faith produces steadfastness* [Jam 1:3] *Blessed are you* when you are **reviled/persecuted**...*Rejoice and be glad* [Mat 5:11]. Problems, difficulties, struggles are an **opportunity** to demonstrate your **faith** and **love** to Christ! Problems and how we handle them, are an opportunity for you and I to **shine bright** for the Lord!

Looking to Jesus and considering Him! - whatever suffering we may

have, considering Jesus helps us get things into **perspective**. He has been through everything we will be asked to go through. He knows all about suffering. Our suffering is **nothing** like what He's endured.

Yet His **joy** in suffering **for us**, **enabled** Him to keep persevering! **Imagine**! JC **deriving joy from** suffering for us **unworthy** sinners! Isaiah foresaw that *out of the anguish of His soul He shall see and be satisfied* [Isa 53:11] (How could anyone 'foresee' such a thing except by inspiration!). Surely that should **affect** and **'move'** us to **exult** in Him! It is a **sin** to be **numb/dead/unmoved** by real/true emotional events! Paul speaks about those who are *past feeling* [Eph 4:19 AV callous=ESV] He says it is *due to their hardness of heart* and the *ignorance that is in them*! Ie, ignorance of the **love** of God and the love of Christ. Such people are *darkened in their understanding* because they were *alienated from the life of God* [Eph 4:17cf]. *There were people **looking** at Jesus on the Cross **without any feeling** of sympathy for Him! They thought He deserved that punishment. So they threw **insults** at Him. They called Him 'names'!

But the picture the Writer wants you/I also to have of Jesus is to **contemplate** Him *seated at the right hand of the throne of God* - the right hand of **authority** and power and **victory**. He wants us to have the view that Stephen had when he was stoned and *gazed up into heaven and saw the glory of God and Jesus standing at the right hand of God* [Acts 7:55]. That is where Jesus is this morning!

Although the Ephesians were converted, Paul **prayed** specifically about their knowledge and **understanding of Jesus Christ**. *I bow my knees before the Father...that you...may...comprehend...what is the breadth, length, height and depth* of Christ's love [Eph 3:18]. Our view of Christ **now** in **NT times** is important. He is **reigning -** and will continue to reign there until all His enemies are made His footstool. *Friends, a lot of people this morning are excited and **hopeful!** They are excited about the things their new hero has told them. They are excited about **Jeremy Corbyn** and what he has **promised**. He indeed has had a a wonderful victory. We wish him well. But his promises are small even if fulfilled to the letter **compared** to the promises of X! For He is at in the place of **power** *seated at the right hand of the throne of God* - the place of **grace**!
