WLC Q. 105. What are the sins forbidden in the first commandment? A. The sins forbidden in the first commandment are...estranging ourselves, and apostatizing from God; praying, or giving any religious worship, to saints, angels, or any other creatures; all compacts and consulting with the devil, and hearkening to his suggestions... **WCF Ch. 25. Of the Church. 6.** There is no other head of the Church, but the Lord Jesus Christ; nor can the Pope of Rome, in any sense, be head thereof; but is that Antichrist, that man of sin, and son of perdition, that exalteth himself, in the Church, against Christ and all that is called God. **RPCNA Testimony Ch. 25. 18.** Many antichrists will be present in the world throughout history. Prior to Christ's coming the final 'man of lawlessness' will be revealed. He will be destroyed by Christ.

WLC Q. 105. What are the sins forbidden in the first commandment? A. The sins forbidden in the first commandment are...estranging ourselves, and apostatizing from God; praying, or giving any religious worship, to saints, angels, or any other creatures; all compacts and consulting with the devil, and hearkening to his suggestions; making men the lords of our faith and conscience... **WCF Ch. 20. Of Christian Liberty, and Liberty of Conscience. 2.** God alone is Lord of the conscience, and hath left it free from the doctrines and commandments of men, which are, in any thing, contrary to His Word; or beside it, if matters of faith, or worship. So that, to believe such doctrines, or to obey such commands, out of conscience, is to betray true liberty of conscience: and the requiring of an implicit faith, and an absolute and blind obedience, is to destroy liberty of conscience, and reason also.
