Why are some Christians content with borderline Christianity?

- Because of Convenience
- Because of <u>Comfort</u>
- Because of Conflict
- Because of Commitment

What are the pitfalls of life on the border?

- D-istrust
- D-istance
- D-<u>ivision</u>
- D-efenselessness
- D-ifference

How to avoid borderline Christianity:

- 1. Live a life of <u>surrender</u> to God's purpose (Romans 8:29; Col 4:2-6)
 - God wants you to be like Jesus
- 2. Live a life of submission to God's leadership (Luke 10:1)
 - God needs you to go where he sends you
- 3. Live a life of <u>sanctification</u> (separation) for personal holiness (James 1:27; 1 Peter 1:16; Ephesians 5:1-21)
 - God wants you to reveal who you are

 Titus 2:11-14 For the grace of God that brings salvation has appeared to all men,

 12teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly,
 righteously, and godly in the present age, 13looking for the blessed hope and glorious
 appearing of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ, 14who gave Himself for us, that He
 might redeem us from every lawless deed and purify for Himself *His* own special people,
 zealous for good works.
