"The Bad Samaritan"

John 4:1-30

INTRODUCTION: John moves from demonstrating a religious man's need for salvation (John 3) to a sinful woman's need for salvation (John 4).

How did Jesus address the need of this lost woman? What was His approach and the content of His message?

In order to evangelize the lost, our Savior did the following:

- I. He overcame <u>weariness</u> (v. 6; cp. v. 31-35)
 (Jesus did not allow <u>fatigue</u> to stop Him from spreading the Gospel)
- II. He built a <u>bridge</u> (v. 7-9; cp. v. 27)

 (Jesus was willing to establish <u>rapport</u> by overcoming religious and cultural prejudice and other hindrances)
- III. He seized an open door (v. 10-15)

 (Jesus sought the opportunity to turn an "earthly" [natural] conversation into a "heavenly" [spiritual] conversation)
- IV. He exposed the fact of <u>sin</u> (v. 16-18)

 (Jesus showed the woman her need for salvation)
- V. He taught essential doctrine (v. 19-24)

 (Jesus corrected the woman's spiritual misunderstanding and instructed her in Biblical truth)
- VI. He pointed people to <u>Himself</u> (v. 14, 25-26)
 (Jesus showed Himself to be the source of salvation John 14:6)
