- 2. You desire and do not have. You murder and are jealous —yet you cannot get what you want. You battle and wage war. You do not have because you do not ask.
- **3.** You ask and do not receive because you ask wickedly, so that you may spend on your pleasures.

- B. Rejected anyway (Gen. 4:4b-7; ls. 58:1-5)
- C. Wicked prayer requests (Acts 8:9-24; Lk. 12:13-21; Mt. 6:19-24, 33)
- D. Ask the generous God (1 Tim. 6:3-10; Jn. 3:16)
