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**JOHN: The glory of Jesus—Part 25**

Sermon: **John 13:34,35**

***The glory of Jesus in giving "a new commandment."***

We see:

1. Jesus illustrates this *new commandment* in foot washing.
2. Jesus exposes one who cannot live by this *new commandment*.
3. Living by this *new commandment* gives evidence of Who we belong to.
4. When Jesus administers the *new commandment*, He reminds of human weakness in spite of eager devotion.

The Church is called to be a confessing church, that she may be,  
the pillar and ground of the truth (1Tim. 3:15,16)

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**The Westminster Confession of Faith**

**WCF 26.1** All saints, that are united to Jesus Christ their Head, by His Spirit, and by faith, have fellowship with Him in His graces, sufferings, death, resurrection, and glory:(1) and, being united to one another in love, they have communion in each other's gifts and graces,(2) and are obliged to the performance of such duties, public and private, as do conduce to their mutual good, both in the inward and outward man.(3)

**WCF 26.2** Saints by profession are bound to maintain an holy fellowship and communion in the worship of God, and in performing such other spiritual services as tend to their mutual edification;(1) as also in relieving each other in outward things, according to their several abilities and necessities. Which communion, as God offereth opportunity, is to be extended unto all those who, in every place, call upon the name of the Lord Jesus.(2)

**WCF 27.1** Sacraments are holy signs and seals of the covenant of grace,(1) immediately instituted by God,(2) to represent Christ, and His benefits; and to confirm our interest in Him:(3) as also, to put a visible difference between those that belong unto the Church, and the rest of the world;(4) and solemnly to engage them to the service of God in Christ, according to His Word.(5)

**The Heidelberg Catechism**

**106. Q.** But does this commandment (6<sup>th</sup>) speak only of killing?

**A.** By forbidding murder God teaches us that He hates the root of murder, such as envy, hatred, anger, and desire of revenge,[1] and that He regards all these as murder.[2]

**107. Q.** Is it enough, then, that we do not kill our neighbor in any such way?

**A.** No. When God condemns envy, hatred, and anger, He commands us to love our neighbor as ourselves,[1] to show patience, peace, gentleness, mercy, and friendliness toward him,[2] to protect him from harm as much as we can, and to do good even to our enemies.[3]

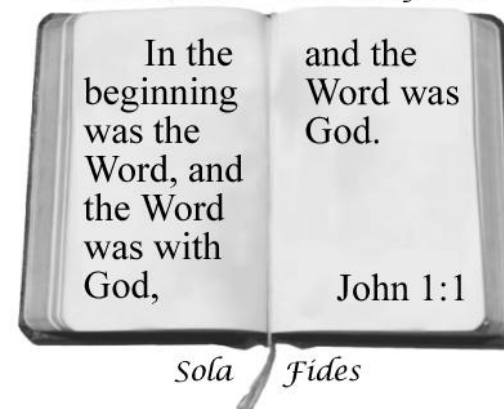

4. If the disciples (and we too!) call Jesus *Teacher* and *Lord*, what ought they then to do?
  
5. Why does Jesus tell the disciples about Judas? (v.19)
  
6. As we live by this *new commandment*, what do we show?
  
7. What ought we to learn in the account of Peter and his denial right after Jesus has given this *new commandment*?
