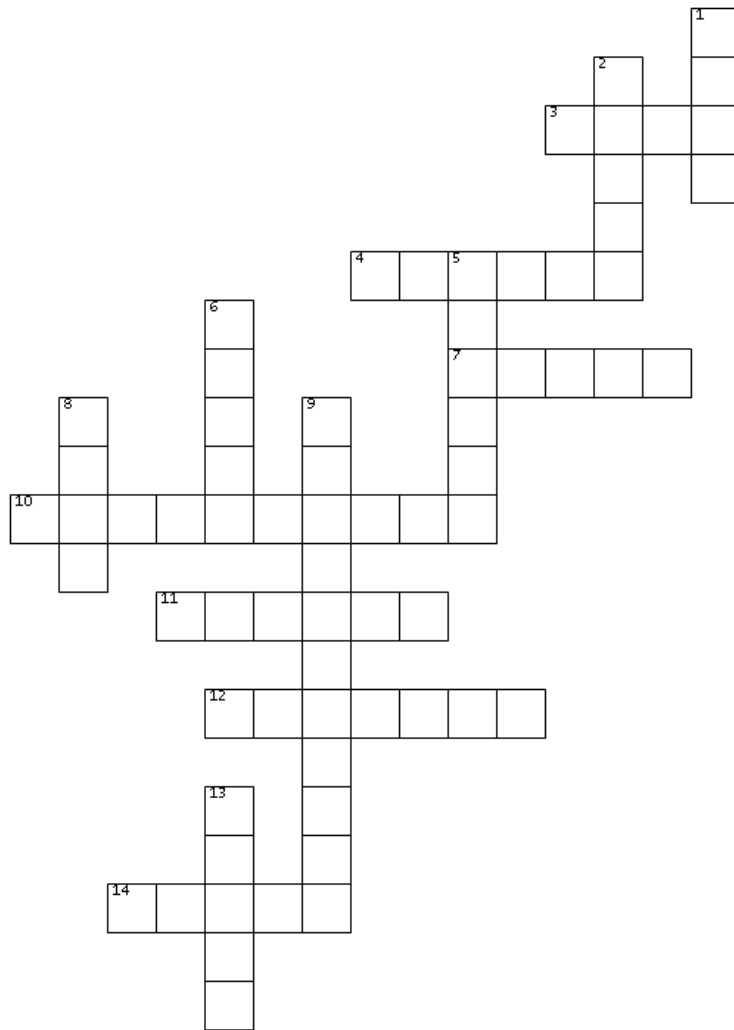

Revelation Summary -

In the Revelation 1:19, the Lord told John to write of three things – the things he was then seeing, the things which are, and the things which shall be hereafter. Thus, an outline of the book is provided for us –

- Revelation 1 – the things which he was seeing.
- Revelation 2-3 – the things which are (the letters to the seven churches).
- Revelation 4-22 – the things which shall be hereafter (Rev. 4-19 - the Seventieth Week of Daniel and the Second Coming of Jesus; Rev. 20 - the Kingdom and final judgment; Rev. 21-22 - the eternal state).

During the Seventieth Week of Daniel, the Lamb (Jesus) opened a book with seven seals. The seventh seal resulted in the sounding of seven trumpets, and the seventh trumpet resulted in the seven bowl judgments.

Revelation 22:1-21

After John's description of the New Jerusalem from its exterior (the shape, the walls, the gates, and the foundations), Revelation 21:21b - Revelation 22:5 gives a description of its interior. After this, Revelation 22:6-21 contains assurances about the truth of the contents of Revelation, warnings to those who ignore or tamper with the contents of the book, encouragements to those who obey, final instructions to John concerning the book, an invitation to those that are spiritually thirsty, and the closing.

Revelation 22:1-5

The New Jerusalem contains...

1. A river of water of life (Rev. 22:1). The source is the throne of God and of the Lamb (one throne). (Genesis 2:10)
2. The Tree of Life (Rev. 22:2). (Genesis 2:9) The leaves have therapeutic benefits.
3. No curse because the throne of God and the Lamb (again, one throne) is there. (Genesis 3:17-19) (Ecclesiastes 1)
4. Occupations for God's slaves. (Rev. 22:3-5) The description "they shall see his face" is about direct access and accountability to the King. (Genesis 2:15)
