## **Discussion Questions**

The following questions are designed to be used by parents in discussing the sermon with their children, but can be used by anyone in discussing the sermon with others:

- 1. What stood out to you in this sermon? Why?
- 2. What does it mean that God is holy, and that Christ's church is to be holy?
- 3. What does it mean to excommunicate a church member?
- 4. Where does a church's authority to excommunicate come from?
- 5. What does the apostle Paul mean in verse 5 by the term, "the day of the Lord"?
- 6. According to verse 5, what is the purpose of excommunicating an unrepentant sinning member? What does this mean?
- 7. Verse 5 speaks of being saved. What does it mean to be saved? Have you been saved? Explain.

## Going Deeper:

These questions are designed for the believer to use in prayer with his/her Lord, and in discussion with brothers and sisters in the Lord:

- 1. How did this sermon challenge your thinking, or grow your understanding?
- 2. When a member of a church is in sin and will not repent, why is it important to remove them from the church? Make a list of all the biblical reasons you can think of.
- 3. What responsibility does Christ give to us individually when we learn that a brother or sister is in sin? How are we to do this?
- 4. After a member is excommunicated, what should be the nature of any interactions we have with the person? Why?
- 5. What should be our hope when we excommunicate an unrepentant sinning member?
- 6. How would you respond to a believer who objects to the idea of excommunicating unrepentant members from a church, claiming that it would be harsh and unloving?
- 7. What is the primary way you should be affected by this sermon this week?
