#### Conclusion from Rev. 10

John is recommissioned in a sense, it is a renewal of his call to prophesy.

Now he must preach the contents of the scroll.

John's message is a global, universal message to the godless nations, but also against the church which is compromising.

Historicists see the two witnesses as the long line of faithful Christian witnesses.

#### Introduction

This interlude, which parallels Rev. 7, spans the whole inter-advent period. And both visions complement each other and correspond to Rev. 7.

### I. Arise and Measure the Temple (1)

- A. A measuring rod like a staff was given to me
  - 1. Cf. 21:15
  - 2. The OT backgrounds is Ezek. 40-48
- B. Arise and measure the temple of God, the altar, and those worshiping in it
  - The holy place and the holy of holies
     The altar = worship, sacrificial calling.
     Those worshiping = the priests (Rev. 1:5; 5:10; Heb. 13:9-16)
  - 2. The temple represents the true Church, the people of God 1 Cor. 3:16-17; 2 Cor. 6:16; Eph.2:21

- 3. Those who worship God in truth (Phil. 3:3)
- 4. Measured: Set it apart for protection.
- 5. Measured: Set it apart for presence Ezek. 42:20-43:9

#### **II.** Do not measure the outer court (2)

- A. The outer court of the temple, leave aside
- B. And do not measure it
- C. Because it was given to the nations, and the holy city shall be trampled for 42 months. Lk. 21:24; cf. Isa. 63:18; Dan. 8:13

Notice, the Holy City (Jerusalem) is equated with the Court of the Gentiles/the outer court Again – 11:8; 16:19; 17:18; 18:9-10, 16, 18, 19, 21
This is another reversal, but one that should not surprise us.
Gal. 4:21-31

42 months – very significant. Equivalent to 1,260 days and times/times and half a time. Rooted in Dan. 7:25; 12:7, 11-12 and Dan. 9:24-27

#### Conclusion

- 1. We see the Church is the dwelling place of God, the worshiping community.
- 2. Yes, there is opposition and hostility.
- 3. There is safety in the inner sanctuary. To know Him and to be known by Him.
