You shall not murder.

Worship Guide SINGING THE PSALMS: PART 2

SALM singing, as we saw last week, has been part of the worship of God's people since the time they were written; and, while they have seen a decline in the nineteenth and first part of the twentieth century among some denominations, they have come back to be a part of the worship of God's people in the last few decades.

Last week, we asked three questions: to whom has the Psalter been given, what are they about, and what commands have been given to the church to sing the Psalms? We answered the first of those questions and concluded that the Psalms have been given to all of God's people, Old Testament, New Testament, and the church even today.

This week, we answer the question, what are the Psalms about? According to Jesus, the whole Bible, and yes even the Psalms, they are about Jesus (Luke 24:44). The disciples on the road to Emmaus learned that day how all of Scripture is about Jesus. Almost half of the times the New Testament quotes the Old, it quotes from the Psalms (116 times, to be exact). The book of Hebrews which is a sermon about how Jesus is better than the signs and figures that pointed to Him, uses ten different Psalms, showing how they are ultimately about Jesus. As Jesus states in Luke 24, the Psalms are about the sufferings and glory of Christ. In Matthew 22:41-46, Jesus quotes from Psalm 110, stating that it is about him. When Jesus was on the cross, he quotes Psalm 22, pointing to His fulfillment of it while on the cross.

We should remember that while some songs are plainly messianic (that is, they are quite obviously about the future Messiah), all Psalms are ultimately about Jesus and, when we sing to our Rock, our Shield, our Refuge, Fortress, our King, our Salvation, and our Redeemer, we are singing to Jesus; for Jesus is the Mediator of God's redemption.

Because much of the church has lost the singing of Psalms, we have also forgotten how they point to Christ, His person, offices, natures, suffering, and glory, so that even the Psalms which speak of the Psalmist confessing his sin (Psalm 51) speak as the Divine Psalmist, Jesus, who became sin; he became the most sinful being ever to live when he took upon himself the sin of His people.

Blessed is the man that does not walk in the counsel of the ungodly...but his delight is in the law of the Lord! (Psalm 1:1, 2)
