Revelation 17:14 OT: Deuteronomy 17:14-20

Theme: Jesus Christ *is* King of Kings and Lord of Lords. He is not dependent upon us to make him Lord; he is not waiting to establish his rule and kingdom. He reigns in power now! The only question is when we will acknowledge his power and submit to his loving rule.

Background & Introduction: Will the Queen choose her successor? Who would want the job?

I. A King in Israel

- A. Israel's true King
 - 1. Israel *always* had a King!
 - Exodus 15:18; Numbers 23:21; Judges 8:23; 1 Samuel 8:7
 - 2. Israel's Desire for a King 1 Samuel 8:7,19
- B. God's plan for a King
 - 1. Kingship foreseen
 - Abraham (Genesis 17:6)
 - Jacob (Genesis 49:10)
 - Moses (Deuteronomy 17:14-20)
 - 2. Chosen by the Lord
 - a. Saul (1 Sam.9, 10)
 - b. David (1 Samuel 16; 13:14)

II. The Role of a King

- A. Ruling in the name of the Lord (Deuteronomy 17:14-20)
 - 1. Mediate God's law, justice for the people - Jeremiah 33:15 (cf. Isaiah 11:1-4)
 - 2. Answering to God - All rulers (Psalm 2)
- B. Defend and protect the people of GodA champion in battle (1 Samuel 8:20)
- C. An impossible task?

III. The King of Kings

- A. The promised King - 2 Samuel 7:12,13; Isaiah 9:6,7
- B. The perfect King
 - Ruling in perfect righteousness

 As the one who fulfills all the law and the prophets

- Ruling in love
 John 13:1; Ephesians 5:2
- 3. The perfect "defender" (Genesis 3:14,15)
- C. King over all
 - 1. The Kingdom of Power
 - a. Ruling over all creation (Colossians 1:16-17)
 Psalm 2:9; Hebrews 1:8; Revelation 5:5; Proverbs 8:15; 21:1
 - b. For His own Kingdom- He is not building an earthly kingdom! (John 6:15; 18:36)
 - 2. The Kingdom of Grace
 - a. Christ rules over the His church
 - The head of his church (cf. Ephesians 1:22; 4:15; 5:23; Colossians 1:18; 2:19)
 - He has a body The church! (Eph.1:22; 1 Cor. 12)
 - There is a mystical union between Christ and the church (1 Corinthians 12:27)
 - b. Grounded in his work of redemption
 - You are not a member/part of this kingdom by virtue of your humanity or national allegiance
 - c. It is a spiritual kingdom
 - Observed everywhere the gospel is preached (Romans 14:17)
 - Empowered by the Holy Spirit (Acts 2:30-33)
 - d. This Kingdom is *advancing* (Matthew 12:28)
 - NOTE: We can't tie it to cultural, political or economic "institutions". This Kingdom is "not of this world"!
 - e. It is a Present reality! (Matthew 3:2)

IV. His Royal Subjects

- A. Reigning with Him
 - Revelation 22:1-5; Ephesians 2:6; 2 Timothy 2:12
- B. Ruling through Him
 - With authority to correct one another, to pray for one another.
 - With responsibility to protect one another
 - With the power to subdue sin
- C. As we submit to His authority Jesus Is Lord!
