XVII. Submission in Marriage - Pt 1

- A. The Wife's Responsibility vs 1-6
 - 1. Wives, likewise
 - a. Women in the Roman Empire
 - i. women were not much more than servants in the household
 - living w/ their father under *patria potestas* which granted life/death power to the father
 - Husbands had a similar power
 - ii. When women came to Christ
 - the unbelieving husband or father could be very difficult
 - they needed to know how to possible win the unbelieving spouse
 - Paul deals with this in 1 Co 7:10ff
 - iii. Paul also deals with the Spiritual equality of women in Ga 3:27-28
 - iv. He, like Peter, deals with roles which God has established Eph 5:22; Col 3:18
 - b. likewise refers back to the 2 previous examples of submission
 - i. citizens to civil authorities 2:13
 - ii. Servants to masters 2:19
 - 2. Submissive and Faithful vs 1-2
 - a. be submissive to your own husbands 1Co 14:34; Eph 5:22; Col 3:18; Tit 2:5
 - i. *hupotasso* pres. tense, middle voice, emphasizing continual action, done by/to oneself (submitting yourself)
 - ii. own husbands
 - does not imply inferiority
 - points to the intimacy of marriage not to be servile to all men
 - iii. that even if some do not obey the word,
 - commentary says that this one is an unbeliever
 - 1 Co 7:10-16 speaks to the Christian spouse staying with the unbeliever for the possibility of winning them to Christ
 - how is a wife to deal with a husband in the sanctification process when he disobeys the word?
 - b. They may be won 1Co 7:16 to Christ or obedience
 - i. without a word.
 - not saying that a wife cannot bring verbal correction, exhortation, or admonition
 - -if he won't listen, the wife is not to become the contentious one Pr 19:13; 21:9, 19; 25:24; 27:15
 - ii. when they observe epopteuo to inspect, watch:--behold. 1Co 9:19-
 - 22; 1 Pet 2:12 life gives credence to the message
 - your chaste conduct
 - -hagnos clean, innocent, modest, perfect: chaste, clean, pure.
 - -toward God and her husband
 - accompanied by fear
 - -phobos alarm or fright: be afraid, fear, terror.
 - -same word used in 2:17 of one's attitude toward God
 - -Eph 5:22 as to the Lord

3. Modest - vs 3-6

- a. Do not let your adornment be merely outward common in Roman culture i. *kosmos* orderly arrangement, decoration; the world (in a wide or narrow sense, including its inhabitants, (morally)):--adorning, world. ii. does not prohibit the use of
 - arranging the hair styling hair
 - wearing gold wearing jewelry
 - or putting on fine apparel nice clothes
 - Solomon's bride was beautifully adorned Song 1:10; 4:11; 7:1
 - Isaiah warned of women who were spiritual shallow **Is 3:16-24** iii. let it be the hidden person of the heart, Ro 2:29; 7:22; 2Co 4:16; 1Ti 2:9-10; Tit 2:3;
 - person anthropos man-faced, a human being, man.
 - with the incorruptible beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit,

-the character of the new man demonstrated

- *aphthartos* undecaying (in essence or continuance):--not (in-, un-)corruptible, immortal.
- *praus* mild, (by implication) humble:--meek
- *hesuchios* keeping one's seat (sedentary), still (undisturbed, undisturbing):--peaceable, quiet.

-this was a contrast to a boisterous or contentious woman

- which is very precious in the sight of God *poluteles* extremely expensive:--costly, very precious, of great price.
- b. For in this manner, in former times,
 - i. the holy women Ru 3:11; Pro 31:10-31
 - who trusted in God also adorned themselves,
 - -elpizo to expect, confide:--(have, thing) hope(-d) (for), trust.
 - -it is God that changes a man Pr 21:1
 - being submissive to their own husbands not unprecedented
 - ii. as Sarah obeyed Abraham, calling him lord, Ge 18:12
 - *kurios* supreme in authority, controller; Master (as a respectful title):-- God, Lord, master, Sir.
 - a practice in life before she ever said it in Ge 18:12
 - -In Egypt, in Pharaoh's harem Ge 12:11-16
 - -In Gerar, in Abimelech's harem Ge 20:1-18
 - iii. whose daughters you are if you
 - do good *agathopoieo* follow her example of submission and modesty
 - and are not afraid with any terror.
 - -phobeo to frighten, to be alarmed; to be in awe of, revere:--be (+ sore) afraid, fear (exceedingly), reverence.
 - -ptosis alarm:--amazement.
 - -not giving in to the fear of what might happen

Ps 27:1 The LORD is my light and my salvation; Whom shall I fear? The LORD is the strength of my life; Of whom shall I be afraid?

Pr 1:33 But whoever listens to me will dwell safely, And will be secure, without fear of evil."

Pr 29:25 The fear of man brings a snare, But whoever trusts in the LORD shall be safe.
