Still 'tis God's hand that leadeth me.


Refrain:

CMPC Sermon Notes for September 26, 2021

- Series- Timeless Questions from the Psalms
- Message:

"What Shall I Render to the Lord for All His Benefits to Me?"

• Text: Psalm 116

• What are the benefits of being a believer? How do we respond to God for those benefits?

The Resolve, 1-2

- The first benefit is a sense of resolve, or purpose
- Love for God- Present tense verb
 - A resolve to trust God exclusively and worship him explicitly
- Why?
 - God has demonstrated his love for the psalmist with a track record of hearing prayer.
 - God has heard, hears and will hear
 - How do we know? The unchangeableness of God.
 - o God's past is the guarantee and revelation of the future. (Alexander Maclaren)

The Revelation, 3-11

- The second benefit is God's presence in a difficult situation
- What was the situation?
 - Illness? Verse 3 and 10 sound like it.
 - Opposition? 11
 - Job-like experience?
 - Never explicitly told
- Borrows the language of Psalm 18
- Death pictured as attacking
 - Distress, anguish
- Refuge found in the name of the Lord
 - God's name reveals what he is like
 - Hagar: The God who sees
 - Abraham: The Lord will provide
- A desperate prayer, 4
 - God is gracious
 - God is righteous

- God is merciful
- He preserves the simple
 - o What a verse!
 - The simple- in psalms, the gullible feckless people who roam the pages of Proverbs drifting into trouble.
 - It is humble for the psalmist to identify with them and humble for God to have time for them.
- Rest
- Delivered my soul from death, eyes from tear, feet from stumbling
- True son of Abraham: 9
 - o Hope and declaration- I will walk before the Lord in the land of the living.
- I believed...
 - Though greatly afflicted, 10
 - Brutal in assessment, 11
 - All men are liars- a lot of frustration in his hyperbole

The Response, 12-19

- How do I respond to all his benefits?
- Partake of his salvation-pick up the cup to drink it and receive a blessing
- Pray
- Pay my vows... we do not know what these were but presumably offered during his distress
- All of this in the presence of others
- Our pilgrimage ends in death, which God views as precious
- Your servant... set free
- Similar to above
- Summons to all to praise the Lord and share the joy
