Contest of the Gods

(1 Kings 18:19-40)

- I. CHOOSE YOUR GOD (v. 21)
 - **A.** <u>A Jealous God</u> (Ex 20:1-6, Rev 3:16)—half-hearted is unacceptable
 - **B.** A Necessary Choice (Josh 24:14-24; Mat 6:24)—His claim is comprehensive, exclusive
 - C. A Divided Heart (Mk 12:30)
 - **1. A pure heart is an undivided heart** (Mt 5:8)—no conflicting loyalties
 - 2. We are humanly incapable of pure devotion; God must do it! (v. 37; Ps 86:11; Jer 24:7; Ezek 11:19-21)—Christ fulfills
- II. THE PROPHETS OF BAAL (vs. 25-29)—emphasis on human effort
 - **A.** <u>Verbose</u> (v. 21, 29; Mat 6:7-8; Rom 8:26)—long, wordy, repetitive; formulaic rather than relational
 - **B.** <u>Ritual</u> (v. 21; Mat 15:2-9)—dancing around the altar; performing to please God
 - **C.** <u>Volume</u> (vs. 27-28; Ps 121:3-4; Ps 139; Mat 10:27)—shouted louder; God is not interested or paying attention
 - **D.** <u>Self-Torture</u> (v. 28; Lev 19:28 & 21:5-6; Lk 5:1-5)—cut themselves *Punishing ourselves devalues Christ's atonement, insults God's grace*
 - **E.** Religious Frenzy (v. 29;)—self-induced enthusiasm and fervor
- III. THE PROPHET OF THE LORD—emphasis on God's power and glory
 - **A.** <u>Confronts the People</u> (v. 21)—God initiates, pursues
 - **1. Presents the Issue**—the question you need to be asking
 - **2. Appeals to Reason**—think logically; reason not an enemy of faith
 - **B.** Repairs the Altar (vs. 30-32)—presents an object lesson

- **1. Recalling Covenant History**—reminds them of their history, their relation to the LORD and to the patriarchs
- 2. Reviving, Not Reinventing True Religion—back to basics
- **C. Ups the Ante**—all God; nothing of human effort, advantage, resource
 - **1. More <u>Manpower</u> for Baal's prophets** (v. 22)—strength in numbers
 - **2. First <u>Choice</u> for Baal's prophets** (v. 25)—better offering will produce better results
 - **3. More <u>Time</u> for Baal's prophets** (vs. 26, 29)—more likely something will happen if you give it enough time
 - **4.** A <u>Soggy</u> Offering for the LORD (vs. 32-35)—proves no tricks
- **D. Prays** (vs. 36-37)
 - **1. Calm**—no special fervor or dramatic performance
 - **2. Simple and Direct**—no formula, ritual, special words or repetition
 - **3. Expectant**—not persuading or coercing a disinterested deity
- **IV.** THE ONLY REAL GOD (vs. 38-39)
 - **A.** The God Who Answers (vs. 37-38)
 - 1. Baal's silence proves he is not God. (v. 29)—not able to answer
 - 2. Satan's power is limited.(1 Cor 10:19-20; Mat 24:24; 2 Thes 2:9; Rev 13:13)—only what God allows him to have
 - **3. God is attentive to His people** (1 Pet 3:12/Ps 34:15)—You don't have to do something spectacular to gain notice or obtain His favor.
 - **B.** The God Who Performs Miracles (Ps 77:13-14)
 - 1. Christianity insists upon a God who performs miracles.
 - 2. God does not perform on command; God commands and performs!
 - C. The God Who Deserves Worship (Isa 64:4)—He IS the ONLY God.
