
"King Jesus Conquers a Pagan Stronghold"

Acts 11: 19 – 26

¹⁹ Now those who were scattered because of the persecution that arose over Stephen traveled as far as Phoenicia and Cyprus and Antioch, speaking the word to no one except Jews. ²⁰ But there were some of them, men of Cyprus and Cyrene, who on coming to Antioch spoke to the Hellenists also, preaching the Lord Jesus. ²¹ And the hand of the Lord was with them, and a great number who believed turned to the Lord. ²² The report of this came to the ears of the church in Jerusalem, and they sent Barnabas to Antioch. ²³ When he came and saw the grace of God, he was glad, and he exhorted them all to remain faithful to the Lord with steadfast purpose, ²⁴ for he was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and of faith. And a great many people were added to the Lord. ²⁵ So Barnabas went to Tarsus to look for Saul, ²⁶ and when he had found him, he brought him to Antioch. For a whole year they met with the church and taught a great many people. And in Antioch the disciples were first called Christians.

King Jesus continues expanding His Kingdom, now including Gentiles not only as a exception, but as a regular part of the Church. Evangelism and Discipleship begin in earnest in Antioch and the King deploys a team to establish the new church in grace and truth. It is such a radically different community that others begin referring to them as "partisans of Christ" or Christians. How are we demonstrating that same kind of allegiance to our King?

First Peter 4: 12 - 19

Beloved, do not be surprised at the fiery trial when it comes upon you to test you, as though something strange were happening to you. But rejoice insofar as you share Christ's sufferings, that you may also rejoice and be glad when his glory is revealed. If you are insulted for the name of Christ, you are blessed, because the Spirit of glory and of God rests upon you. But let none of you suffer as a murderer or a thief or an evildoer or as a meddler. Yet if anyone suffers as a Christian, let him not be ashamed, but let him glorify God in that name. For it is time for judgment to begin at the household of God; and if it begins with us, what will be the outcome for those who do not obey the gospel of God? And "If the righteous is scarcely saved,"

what will become of the ungodly and the sinner?"

Therefore let those who suffer according to God's will entrust their souls to a faithful Creator while doing good.

Matthew 16: 15 - 19

He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter replied, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." And Jesus answered him, "Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father who is in heaven. And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven."

How are evangelism and discipleship central to the life of the Church? PRAY "Lord King, we praise You for Your promises to build Your Church and extend Your Kingdom throughout the earth. Thank You for extending Your grace to us and enfolding us fully in Your loving family."

Monday

READ Acts 11:19-26; Ephesians 2:11-22; Psalm 24:1-10. DISCUSS, How has Jesus demonstrated His lordship over all the earth? Why is it important for His people to submit to Him as Savior and Lord? Where is it most difficult for you to submit? Why? How is discipleship in His Church critical to fighting that battle? PRAY, "Jesus, You are the King. We praise You and submit to Your rule!"

Tuesday

READ Acts 11:19-26; Ephesians 2:11-22; Psalm 24:1-10. DISCUSS, What does it mean to no longer be alienated from the commonwealth of Israel? Why are Gentiles now no longer strangers to the covenant promises? PRAY, "Jesus, thank You for reconciling us to You and one another. Lord, help us to trust You together."

Wednesday

READ Acts 11:19-26; Romans 8:18-25; Psalm 102:1-28. DISCUSS, How is God fulfilling what was longed for in this psalm? Why is waiting such a central aspect of following Christ together? How are you handling waiting? Who at FCCW is the Lord using to help you wait patiently? PRAY, "Lord, sustain us we pray. We long to see You in fullness."

Thursday

READ Acts 11:19-26; Romans 8:18-25; Psalm 102:1-28. DISCUSS, If Jesus is already King, why do we endure such hardship? How do you deal with this ache? How are you encouraging brothers and sisters in Christ? How are you reaching out to those who don't share our hope in Jesus?" PRAY, "Lord, Jesus, come quickly, Lord. Help us as we wait on You."

Friday

READ Acts 11:19-26; Matthew 16:15-19; First Peter 4:12-19. DISCUSS, How has God been teaching you from these passages this week? REJOICE if God has granted you the gift of faith in Christ! PRAY for renewal and revival across our land.

Saturday

PREPARE today for the worship service tomorrow. There will be both live-stream and in-person services available.

READ **Acts 11:1-30**. Invite others to join you for either the *live-stream or in-person service* tomorrow. Ask Jesus to help us love our neighbors well.
