Joseph's Brothers Go to Egypt Genesis 42:1-38

Main Point:

When God providentially confronts you of your sin and tests you to see if you have changed, respond by repenting and pursuing new obedience.

1. God's providence is always at work in your life.

2. God, in His providence, will sometimes confront you with your sin.

3. He will also providentially test you to see if you have changed.

4. Though this can be difficult, God has a loving purpose behind it.

5. Respond to these providences by repenting of your sin and pursuing new obedience.
