II. Even when it doesn't feel true

- A. There are times when the story of sin doesn't feel true (Hebrews 10:26-27)
- B. There are also times when the story of salvation doesn't feel true

III. For the sake of those who can't tell it

- A. There are many people who could not say what he said.
- B. We must tell the true story to those who don't yet believe.
- C. We must speak *for* those who cannot (see Psalms 6; 42; 137; Lamentations 3:64-66)

IV. Even if the darkness closes in again

- A. The Ninth of Av (5:22-23; Psalm 30:8-12; 39:12-13)
- B. Tell the story anyway (1 Timothy 4:7)

V. Death and Resurrection

- A. Good Friday (Lamentations 3:1-8; Mark 15:34; Matthew 27:34, 41-43).
- B. These bear witness (John 5:39; Luke 24:26-27; Psalm 22; Isaiah 53; Genesis 3:15)
