(vs. 16-20)
Prioritizing:
A. Thanksgiving - "say Amen at thy giving of thanks"
B. Teaching -"that I might teach others also"
C. Transformation -"but in understanding be men"
III. Purpose - "not to them who believe" (vs. 21-22)

Different gifts for the:
A. Stubborn - "yet for all that they will not hear me"
B. Skeptical - "tongues are a sign...to them that believe not"
C. Saints - "but prophesying...for them that believe"
