Clearing the Temple & Cursing the Tree

Matthew 21:12-27

- I. COMING TO HIS TEMPLE (12-17; Mal 3:1-3)
 - A. Claiming His Office (2 Sam 7:12-13; Jn 2:13-22)—to speak and rule for God
 - **1. His First Priority** (Lk 2:49)—His Father's House
 - 2. A <u>Spiritual</u> Kingdom (Jn 18:36)—not of this world
 - **3. The Temple Symbolism** ()—God dwelling with His people
 - a. Jesus is the Temple of God. (Jn 1:14 & 2:19-21)—God in the flesh, living with us
 - **b.** Jesus <u>builds</u> the Temple of God. (Ps 14:5; Mat 16:18; 1 Pet 2:5)—the church
 - B. <u>Cleaning His House</u> (Ps 69:9; Mal 3:2; 1 Pet 4:17)—Jesus will judge & purify the Church
 - **C.** Healing the Sick (Ps 103:3; Isa 53:5)—the blind and lame came to him there
 - 1. Sign of the Messiah (Isa 35:5-6)
 - 2. Application for the Church (Mat 9:12)—Church is a place of healing
 - D. Hearing the Children (Ps 8:2)—children's worship is pleasing to God
 - **1.** <u>The Children</u>—The worship of God is not too dignified to include the praise of children.
 - a. Noisy presence
 - b. Simple faith
 - c. Enthusiastic praise
 - **2.** Their Praises (15-16)
 - a. Is Jesus Worthy?
 - **b.** Is Jesus <u>God</u>? In appealing to Psalm 8, Jesus is indirectly claiming deity.

- E. <u>Leaving the City</u> (Gen 6:3)—divine abandonment of those who reject the Lord's Anointed; the wicked will eventually get their wish.
- II. **CURSING THE TREE** (18-22; 2 Pet 3:3-13)
 - A. Seeing the Fig Tree (Jer 24)—symbolic of Nation of Israel, also individual application
 - B. Being Hungry (18)
 - **1. Jesus' True <u>Humanity</u>** (Mat 4:2; Heb 2:17)—God humbled Himself to experience real human weakness
 - 2. God's Righteous Expectation (Isa 5:4)—the fruit of love and grateful obedience
 - C. Finding No Fruit (Mat 3:10; Jas 2:17)—neither righteousness nor repentance
 - **D.** Withering at Once (Lk 13:6-9; 2 Pet 3:4-7)—catastrophic destruction
 - 1. Sign of Israel's Imminent Judgment—Nation obliterated and temple destroyed
 - **2. Warning of God's Righteous Wrath**—After much patience, judgment comes swiftly and catastrophically.
 - a. God's wrath is <u>real</u> and it is <u>righteous</u>. (Rom 1:18; Eph 5:6)
 - b. God's patience is great but it is not infinite. (Rom 2:4-8)
 - c. Refusing the Savior will result in <u>destruction</u>. (Jn 3:16-18)
