Lesson 3: Doubt and Unbelief (John the Baptist in Prison)

Matthew 11:1-24; Isaiah 35:5-6

- I. A FAITH THAT INCLUDES DOUBTS (1-11)
 - **A.** The Doubt of John (2)—What do we do when Jesus isn't doing what we think He's supposed to be doing?
 - 1. His Vision from God (Mat 3:16; Jn 1:32-34)—at the baptism of Jesus
 - 2. His View from Prison (Jam 5:17)—isolated, physically weak & emotionally stressed
 - 3. His Question of Christ (3; Mk 9:24,)—offering out doubts to God is an act of faith
 - **B.** The Reassurance of Jesus (3-5)—How does Jesus answer our questions and fears?
 - **1.** The Certainty of Scripture (Is 35:5-6; Isa 40:8; Mat 5:18)—divinely inspired, inerrant, authoritative, eternal
 - **2.** The Witness of Others (4)—our vision is limited by our own perspective
 - **C.** <u>The Choice to Be Offended</u> (6; Isa 55:8-9)—You will not always understand; will you be *comforted* by Christ or *offended* by Him?
- II. AN UNBELIEF THAT REFUSES FAITH (6, 12-20)—
 - A. Violent Suppression (12)
 - 1. The Kingdom of Heaven is a threat to the kingdoms of this world.
 - 2. They think they can stop the advance of God's kingdom by force.

- **B.** <u>Determined Dissatisfaction</u> (16-19)—disdainful superiority and implacable unbelief; refusal to accept no matter what
- **C.** <u>Unrepentant Pride</u> (20)—unbelief is not objective; it has a *motive*—rebellion against Christ's authority
- **III.** THE COMING OF JUDGMENT (21-24)
 - A. The Certainty of Judgment (2 Cor 5:10)—All will stand before judgment seat of Christ
 - **B.** The Calculation of Punishment (Lk 12:47-48)
 - 1. Repentance is necessary for salvation.
 - 2. Anyone who repents will be forgiven.
 - 3. Those with more spiritual light will be judged more severely.

Jesus is the mercy and salvation of God for everyone who repents and believes:

Apart from Him, there is no salvation.
