A Righteous Rant & a Scathing Rebuke

Matthew 23:1-39; Deuteronomy 18:15-19

I. THE ROLE OF THE PROPHET (Dt 18:15-19)

- A. <u>Rebuking</u>—confront with sin and call to repent (Elijah, John the Baptist)
- B. <u>Foretelling</u>—predict the future (Isaiah)
- C. <u>Lamenting</u>—mourn over sin and judgment (Jeremiah)

II. <u>THE SIN OF HYPOCRISY</u>—the scathing rebuke

- A. <u>Self-Important</u>—sitting in Moses' seat
 - 1. <u>To Lord It over Others</u> ()—Bind and lay heavy burdens on others (bossy)
 - 2. <u>To Be Seen by Men</u> ()—ungodly motive: seeking human praise rather than God's
 - a. The Place of Honor—seated by social status in the synagogue and at feasts
 - b. The Costume of Righteousness—fringes and phylacteries
 - c. The Recognition of a <u>Title</u>—rabbi, teacher and father, etc...
- B. <u>Insincere</u> (Isa 29:13)—*lip service, not heart or action; not real*
 - 1. <u>A Double Standard</u>—they don't practice what they preach
 - 2. <u>A Deceptive Appearance</u> ()—they aren't what they seem
 - a. Outward Facade of Righteousness-look good on the outside
 - b. Inward <u>Corruption</u> of Character—greed, self-indulgence, lawlessness
- C. <u>Misleading</u>—*blind guides*
 - 1. Leading away from Salvation—shut the kingdom of heaven in people's faces

- 2. Teaching Legalism as Righteousness—straining gnats and swallowing camels
 - a. <u>Technicalities</u> of Swearing ()—loopholes in verbal accountability
 - b. <u>Tithing</u> of Herbs and Spices ()-majoring on minors
 - c. <u>Neglecting</u> Matters of Importance ()—justice, mercy, faithfulness
- D. <u>Persecuting</u> (Mat 5:11-12)—Monument-Builders and Prophet-Killers
 - 1. Claim to honor the prophets of the past
 - 2. Don't listen to what the prophets said
 - 3. Persecute the prophets of their own generation

III. THE LAMENT OVER JERUSALEM (37-39)

- A. The Loving Heart of God (2 Chr 36:15-19)
 - 1. He has been so patient. (Ps 78:36-38) Prophet after prophet, warning after warning
 - 2. He longs to gather. Like a hen gathers her chicks; desire to nurture and protect
 - 3. He weeps to punish. (Jer 13:15-17)

 \rightarrow If we can pronounce judgment on a sinner without weeping, maybe we are not in tune with the heart of the God we claim to represent.

B. The Stubborn Heart of Unrepentance (Isa 30:15-18)

- 1. God is <u>eager</u> to forgive and bless.
- 2. We are the ones who <u>refuse</u> to have it.
 - a. Pride refuses to repent.
 - b. Pride rejects the Savior.
- C. <u>The Desolate House of Israel</u> (35, 36, 38)—*destruction of Jerusalem in 70 AD*
 - **1.** There is no salvation or fruitfulness apart from Jesus Christ.
 - 2. If you reject the Only Savior, you invite destruction.
- 3. <u>The Last Word Of Hope</u> (39; Zec 12:10; Rom 11)—*until you say*
 - 1. The Jewish identity was not lost.
 - 2. Israel is a nation again.
 - 3. The story is not over!
