## **Martha of Bethany**

(Luke 10:38-42; John 11:1-45; 12:1-2)

### I. MARTHA'S CHARACTER

- A. Her Singleness
  - 1. Martha served God and others as a single woman.
  - 2. Jesus had friends who were single women.
- **B.** Her Gifting (Lk 10:38; Jn 12:2)
  - 1. Traditional Homemaker
  - 2. Generous Hospitality
- C. Her Faults (Lk 10:40-41)
  - 1. Distracted and stressed about many things
  - 2. Impatient and ungracious to other people
  - 3. Misses the most important thing
- **D.** Her Theology (Jn 11:21-22, 24, 27)
  - 1. Knowledge of Scripture
  - 2. Profession of Faith
    - a. Jesus' Power
    - b. Jesus' Love
    - c. Her Messiah (Mat 16:16)

# II. MARTHA'S CRISES

A. The Death of Her Brother

- 1. Loss of Relationship/Companionship —a beloved brother
- 2. Loss of Security—legal protection

### B. Her Disappointment with Jesus

- 1. Questioning His Timing—"If you had been here..."
- **2. Questioning His Care**—(Why didn't you come?)
- 3. Questioning His <u>Judgment</u>—"But Lord...!"

### III. JESUS' ANSWER

- **A.** The Glory of God (Jn 11:4-6, 15)—Our crises are His opportunity to show us more of His glory.
- B. The Friendship of Jesus (Jn 11:5-6)
  - 1. God's glory is not contrary to our good. (Jer 29:11; Rom 8:28)—
  - 2. When Jesus doesn't do what we expect, He has better plans. (Isaiah 55:8-9; 64:4; 1 Cor 2:9)
  - **3.** Our crises are an opportunity to know Him better. (Ps 63:1-8)
- **C.** The Lord of Life (Job 19:25-27; Jn 5:25-29)
  - 1. Jesus does not always heal; sometimes He chooses to resurrect.
  - 2. Death does not have the final word; Jesus does!
- D. <u>The I AM</u> (Jn 17:3)—not a philosophical statement; it's a personal. Our faith is in a *Person*—Jesus Christ!
