Tried by the Sanhedrin

Matthew 26:57-68; Isaiah 53

- I. THE IRREGULARITY OF PROCEDINGS (Isa 53:8)—Sanhedrin is highest religious court
 - A. The Late Hour (Lk 22:53)—many members would not be able to attend
 - **B.** <u>The Irregular Location</u> (57-58)—private residence of the top judge; not neutral
 - **C.** The Malicious Intent (59)—looking for a reason to condemn Jesus
 - **D.** The False Witnesses (60; Deut 19:15-19)—case should be dismissed, accusers punished
 - **E.** The Prisoner Abuse (67-68)—mocking, striking, spitting
- II. THE FULFILLMENT OF SCRIPTURE (26:56; Luke 24:25-27, 44-46)—Moses and the Prophets
 - A. The Role of Caiaphas (Lev 16:20-22)—High Priest makes the atonement sacrifice
 - B. The Innocence of Christ (Isa 53:8-9)—the sacrifice without blemish; accusations false
 - **C. The Silence of Christ** (62-63; Isa 53:7-8)
 - 1. The Composure of Jesus (Rev 12:11)—regal bearing, dignity
 - **a. Courage**—unafraid, does not bow or cringe or plead for his life
 - **b. Protest**—does not dignify His accusers with an answer or response
 - 2. The Submission of Jesus (Isa 50:6-8; 53:3)—humility, self-control
 - a. To False Accusation—did not argue or defend Himself
 - **b.** To Degrading Insult—mockery and spitting
 - c. To Physical Violence (Mat 5:38-39)—punching and slapping

- 3. The <u>Acceptance</u> of Jesus (Isa 53:4; Jn 12:27-28; Gal 1:4; Eph 5:2)—accepts the role of sacrifice and scapegoat
- **4. The** Example of Jesus (Heb 12:3; 1 Pet 2:21-23; Mat 5:10-12 & 10:24-25)
 - a. Expect Persecution. (Mat 10:22, 24-25; 16:24)
 - **b. Endure it Patiently.** (Rom 12:12; 2 Tim 2:3; Heb 10:32-39; 1 Pet 2:19-20; Rev 2:3)
 - c. Do Not Retaliate. (Rom 12:19)
 - **d. Trust God.** (1 Pet 2:23)
 - With your Body and Soul (Mat 10:28; Jn 6:40 & 11:25-26)—Resurrection
 - With your Reputation (Isa 50:7-8)—God will vindicate
- III. THE TESTIMONY OF JESUS (63b-66)—Under Oath
 - A. <u>Jesus Acknowledges His Identity.</u> (63b-64a)—the Christ, the Son of God (Israel's King)
 - → Jesus is officially condemned because He is our Savior.
 - **B.** <u>Jesus Prophesies of the Future.</u> (64b; Dan 7:13-14; Heb 6:13-18)—*His return in glory*
 - 1. Jesus promises, under oath, to return!
 - 2. Jesus will judge the church. (Ezk 34; 1 Pet 4:17-19)
 - **C.** <u>Accused of Blasphemy</u> (65-66; Lev 24:13-16)—verbal sin of profaning what is sacred; speaking against or cursing God; misusing or not showing proper reverence for God's name.
 - **1. Jesus does claim divinity.** (Mk 2:7; Jn 5:23, 8:58-59; 10:30-31; Dan 7:13-14)
 - 2. His accusers are the ones blaspheming. (Acts 26:11)
 - 3. Jesus bears our blasphemies to the cross. (Mat 12:31-32)
