### The Stated Purpose of the Parable v 9

Told to those who trusted in themselves and looked down on others

Grace and self-righteousness are mutually exclusive.

#### The Self-Confident Saint

Deut 26:12-15

Who is righteous, justified? Why the Pharisee, of course!

He prayer to himself?

His confidence, his faith, was in himself, and in what he did.

"Am I good enough?" "Is Christ good enough?"

#### The Self-Aware Sinner

Why are Tax Collectors hated?

His prayer - the sinner's prayer.

I need pure mercy. I bring no claims, I have nothing to exchange.

## A Shocking Revelation

The tax collector, the great sinner is justified by pure grace. The Pharisee failed. He was on the works treadmill. If you exalt yourself, you will be humbled. If you humble yourself, you will be exalted. Your pride is killing you! Confession and repentance receives the love and grace of God.
