Matthew 20:17-28

- I. SPEAKING OF DEATH (17-19)—that conversation you don't want to (but need to) have
 - A. The Occasion (17)—Going up to Jerusalem
 - 1. Approaching His Destiny (Isa 50:6-8)
 - 2. Preparing His Disciples
 - B. The Repetition (Mat 16:21 & 17:22-23)—Third time He has officially told them this
 - 1. His Knowledge of the Future—What happens will not be a surprise to Jesus.
 - 2. His Command of the Situation (Jn 10:18)—Jesus is calling the shots.
 - 3. His Dedication to the Plan (Mt 16:23; Jn 15:13)—This is God's plan.
 - C. The Doctrine—the Sacrificial Atonement of Christ

(28; Isa 51:5; Jn 1:29; Rom 5:6; 1 Cor 15:3; 1 Pet 1:18-19 & 3:18)

- 1. Jesus came to sacrifice Himself in our place.
- 2. His blood is necessary and sufficient for our salvation.
- II. POLITICKING FOR POSITION (20-21, 23b-28)
 - A. Manipulative Maneuvers
 - 1. An Ambitious Mother (20-21)—wants honor and distinction for her sons
 - 2. Those Sneaky Sons of...! (22)—trying to manipulate Jesus with Mom
 - 3. (Un)Righteous Indignation (24)—self-centered and easily offended
 - **4.** Assigned Seats (23; Isa 49:1-4; Eph 2:10)—God the Father has chosen the people and prepared the places

B. Opposing Models of Leadership

- 1. The Rulers of the Gentiles (25)—arrogant, self-serving, domineering authority
- 2. The Son of Man (28)—humble, self-sacrificing, other-serving authority
- C. The Cost of Greatness—You don't know what you're asking.
 - 1. Humility
 - 2. Self-sacrifice
 - 3. Service
- **III. DRINKING THE CUP** (22-23; Isaiah 51:17-23)
 - A. The Fellowship of the Cup—Sharing a Life and Destiny; an act of intimate friendship
 - **1. Sharing in Christ's Glory** (Rom 8:17)—future
 - 2. Sharing in Christ's <u>Suffering</u> (Phil 3:10)—now
 - **3. Sharing in Christ's Character** (Rom 5:3-4; 8:18; Heb 12:10)—Greatness is everything that He is.
 - B. The Contents of the Cup (Isa 51:17, 22; Jer 25:15-16)—suffering
 - 1. Christ's <u>Unique</u> Role as Savior (Mat 26:39, 42)—the Cup of God's Wrath
 - 2. Our Identification with Christ (Mat 16:24)—what we suffer in order to follow Jesus
 - C. The Inevitability of the Cup (23; Mat 10:17-25; 16:24; Jn 18:11; 2 Tim 2:12)—The cost of discipleship.
 - **D.** <u>The Honor of the Cup</u> (Mat 5:11-12; Acts 5:41; Phil 1:29; 1 Pet 2:21)
 - 1. Suffering for the sake of Christ is:
 - a. Evidence of God's Favor—does not earn us God's favor
 - **b.** A Result of Our Salvation—does not earn merit for salvation
 - 2. You can't buy love, but it will cost you! (Song 8:7; 1 Cor 13:3)
 - **3.** The lover will gladly pay the cost of love. (2 Sam 24:24; Ps 63:3; 73:25)— LOVE, not duty or fear, is what motivates the saints and martyrs.
